Radovan Jelašić was born in 1968 in Baja, Hungary. In 1992 he graduated from the University of Belgrade's Faculty of Economics and went on to take an MBA at the University of Illinois, Chicago, USA.

Mr. Jelašić began his banking career with Deutsche Bank in Frankfurt, where he worked for four years as a Regional Manager for Central and Eastern Europe. In 1999 he moved to McKinsey & Company Inc., working on banking projects in Germany, Poland and Bulgaria in the field of credit financing, privatization, corporate takeover, organizational restructuring and mortgage financing.

From December 2000 until July 2003 Mr. Jelašić held the position of Vice-Governor of the National Bank of Yugoslavia/Serbia during which time he was in charge of the development and implementation of banking sector restructuring, reform of the banking supervision process, negotiations with the IMF, World Bank and EU on programs related to the financial sector, as well as the reorganization of the NBS IT Department.

On February 25, 2004, the Serbian Parliament appointed Mr. Jelašić Governor of the National Bank of Serbia. He began his term in office on March 1, 2004.
