announcing the Sixth Conference of the
South-Eastern Monetary History Network (SEEMHN)

hosted by the National Bank of Romania
in Bucharest, Romania
on 18 March 2011

Following the success of the previous five annual conferences of the South-Eastern European Monetary History Network held in Sofia (BNB) in 2006, Vienna (OeNB) in 2007, Athens (BoG) in 2008, Belgrade (NBS) in 2009 and Istanbul (TCMB) in 2010, the National Bank of Romania takes great pleasure in hosting the Sixth Annual Conference in March 2011. This reflects the National Bank of Romania's support to the SEEMH Network, whose main objective is to extend the knowledge of the economic history of the Balkans as an integral part of the Pan-European experience with a specific focus on financial, monetary and banking history.

The Sixth **SEEMHN** Conference will take place on Friday, **18 March 2011, in Bucharest**. The topic of the conference will be "Monetary Policies and Banking Institutions in South-Eastern Europe between National Objectives and European Patterns – a Historical and Comparative Perspective". Academician Daniel Dăianu, former Minister of Finance, has been invited to deliver the key-note speech. The Organizing Committee would like to invite all researchers from academic, central banking and commercial banking institutions to submit paper proposals or to contribute to conference discussions. Interested researchers should submit their papers or extended proposal to Ms. Brîndușa Costache (brandusa.costache@bnro.ro) no later than 14 January 2011. Authors of the accepted papers will be notified no later than 11 February 2011. The conference version of the paper and the presentation version are expected by 14 March 2011. The papers should meet the usual scientific standards and address the main theme of the conference in a broad interpretation. Selected papers will be published in the Conference Proceedings Volume. Participation in the conference is not conditional upon presenting a paper. All participants are expected to cover their own expenses.
