Dimitri G Demekas is Assistant Director of the Monetary & Capital Markets Department at the IMF. He is responsible for financial sector surveillance issues and helps manage the joint IMF-World Bank *Financial Sector Assessment Program* (FSAP). He was the principal author of the 10-year review of the FSAP, completed by the IMF Executive Board in September 2009. Prior to this assignment, he was Chief of the Southeastern Europe I Division at the IMF's European Department and the Fund's coordinator for regional issues in the Balkans. He has worked on financial sector issues in Asia and on macroeconomic issues in both Western and Eastern European countries. He has published extensively on transition economies, labor markets, and the economics of post-conflict aid. In 2003, he was seconded from the IMF to work as Special Advisor to the Greek Presidency of the EU, where he covered, among other topics, EU relations with Russia and the Western Balkans. He was one of the main contributors to the *Thessaloniki Agenda for the Western Balkans* of June 2003.
