THE EISENHOWER EXCHANGE FELLOWSHIPS INC

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

14 July 1954

It has long been my hope to acquire first hand experience in U.S. methods as applied to industrial and financial organization and to economic problems in general. The Eisenhower Fellowship provides a unique and gratifying opportunity to observe at the management level the application of these methods and techniques and to obtain an understanding of the American way of life.

An essential element in the effort to develop Greece's economy is the revitalization of a capital market and the reorientation of Greece's banking system and financial institutions along sound and progressive lines. This is important not only for the mobilization of Greek capital into channels which will contribute to Greece's development and industrialization but also to help promote a close association and cooperation with banking and financial organizations in the U.S. so that a flow of U.S. private capital into Greece may be encouraged and facilitated. In this connection, the establishment of personal contacts with leading U.S. bankers will be of great value.

On my return to Greece I expect to be closely associated with central and investment banking in addition to my duties as Director General of the Ministry of Coordination with special planning and coordinating responsibilities for state investment and the development program. It is, therefore, of considerable value to obtain a close insight into the organization, operation and, especially, the management of financial institutions in the U.S., particularly those engaged in investment banking and international finance. Areas of special interest in which I would, therefore, like to acquire direct knowledge and experience include the following:

A. Banks - internal organization of major U.S. Banks, methods and techniques of management control, degree and types of mechanization, categories of business handled and criteria and procedures used in engaging in domestic and international investment, as distinct from short term commercial banking.

B. Investment houses - organization, criteria, underwriting techniques, preparation of prospecti, stock exchange and S.E.C. regulations and methods of enforcement, etc. In the above connection more detailed knowledge from a

major financial institution's standpoint of the New York and other U.S. capital markets and of the structure and sources of business finance is sought. Perhaps the most systematic approach would be to spend from 45 days to two months in a position as close as possible to the management level of a leading New York investment bank followed by an intensive but shorter review of similar problems in a Chicago or California institution.

In addition to the above principal fields of interest, the following are also considered to be of particular importance for my anticipated work in Greece:

(a) Organization and management of major government or semi-government economic and financial agencies, as for example the Budget Bureau, the Federal Reserve Board, the Export Import Bank;

(b) Organization and management of certain bodies representative of American development activities such as the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, the Tennessee Valley Authority and related agencies.

(c) Organization and management of major industrial establishments including steel and large engineering works, oil refineries, nitrogenous fertilizer plants, alumina and aluminium works and sugar factories. Emphasis is placed on the above since the government development plan includes the establishment of industries of this type. Such visits might be quite short since the principal aspects on which I shall concentrate my attention would be less of a detailed technical character and more of general organization, finance, trade and, especially, management.

In view of my academic responsibilities as lecturer of political economy (applied and theoretical) at the University of Athens, opportunities for short visits to leading American universities and meetings with professors and experts in economics and business administration would be appreciated. I am particularly interested in the methods and organization of university training courses for business executives and potential managers. I would like to emphasize that I am also very anxious to obtain a fuller understanding of ways and trends of thought and attitudes in the United States and to have opportunities for general discussions with representative people throughout the country. I sincerely hope that such experience will substantially widen my understanding of current economic and industrial problems and will be very valuable in assisting the development and industrialization of Greece through the formulation of the appropriate government policies, the application of suitable banking and financial techniques and the promotion of a closer understanding between the U.S. and Greece. I also believe that the contacts which will be made during such a visit will be valuable for the establishment of a fuller cooperation between economic and financial circles in our two countries.

APPLICANT'S PERSONAL HISTORY

After my basic university training at the University of Athens, I was engaged for a number of years in private legal practice and economic advisory work with the leading banks in Greece. I have always been very interested in economic problems from an analytical as well as from a practical point of view and accordingly have devoted almost five years to research and teaching in economics at the University of Cambridge. This has given me most of the theoretical background with which I have worked on my return to Greece.

During the last four years I have been fully occupied with the practical problems of planning Greek economic reconstruction development and with the formulation and application of Government policies designed to establish and maintain economic and financial stability in Greece. A substantial part of these policies was closely associated with central and commercial banking practices and with the reorganization of long term industrial credit. The requirements of the country and the degree of specialization in Greece are such that economic and financial experts are frequently used in more than one of three principal fields, namely: (a) academic economics and university teaching; (b) central and/or investment banking; and (c) Government work, especially economic and financial planning.

I have also been occupied at various times or simultaneously in the above fields and a shift from banking to public work and vice versa is quite possible and indeed probable on my return. This explains the relative variety of my interests in case an opportunity were presented for my visiting the United States, and my desire to acquire in addition to a more detailed experience in banking and finance a fuller understanding of American life and attitudes.

A) Director-General of the Greek Ministry of Coordination, which is the Department of Economic Planning and Development of the Greek Government. The Ministry of Coordination is responsible also for the formulation and supervision of economic and financial policies.

The main fields of Government action covered by the above position are the following:

- 1) All matters associated with the external financial relations of Greece (including FOA and International Bank operations).
- 2) Preparation of the State Investment program (determination of the overall size and composition by sections of economic activity and projects) with special reference to the economic and financial aspects and organization of the particular development projects.
- 3) Approval of foreign investments in Greece, particularly for the purpose of extending the special guarantees and privileges provided by the Greek constitutional law for such investments.
- 4) Formulation and supervision (in cooperation with the Management of the Bank of Greece and the "Currency Committee") of monetary and banking policies.
- 5) Formulation and supervision (in cooperation with the Ministry of Finance) of the general characteristics and implementation of the Central Government budget and of the related fiscal policies.
- 6) General objectives and follow up (in cooperation with the Ministry of Commerce) of the foreign trade and foreign exchange policies and of internal trade and price policies.

B) Director of the Bank of Greece -- responsible for economic and financial research and advice.

C) Lecturer in Political Economy, University of Athens.

General Fields of Interest

In addition to a general interest in acquiring deeper understanding of American attitudes, ways of life, and trends of thought, the following are the principal fields of general interest:

- a) Organization, policies and procedures of the principal financial agencies of the United States, such as the Federal Reserve Board and Banks, the Export-Import Bank, the Foreign Operations Administration, the Budget Bureau, etc.
- b) Organization and management of certain bodies representative of American development activities, such as the Tennessee Valley Authority.
- c) Organization and management of major industrial establishments, including steel and large engineering works, oil refineries, nitrogenous fertilizer plants, alumina and aluminum works and sugar factories. Emphasis is placed on the above since the development plan of the Greek Government includes the establishment of industries of this type. The particular aspects on which the information would be sought are associated with the general organization and factory or works lay-out (as opposed to details of a technical nature), finance, marketing, and especially management.
- d) Methods and organization of university teaching courses, particularly those designed for business executives and potential managers.

Fields of Special Interest and Concentration:

Investment banking in its internal and international aspects and activities, with special emphasis on the following aspects:

- a) Criteria and procedures of assessment, from an investment bank's point of view, of alternative proposals for long-term financing. It would be very helpful if the whole series of steps and phases of an investment bank lending operation could be followed in as much detail as possible.
- b) Sources, types, procedures and conditions of international long-term financing. The possibility of following one or more transactions of this category through their various stages would be also much appreciated.
- c) In connection with the above fields of concentration, the work and regulations of the Securities Exchange Commission are of particular relevance and importance. This is especially interesting in view of the Greek Government's policy to revitalize the internal capital market as a means of mobilizing resources for new investment and development.
- d) A follow-up of financial and banking operations in New York and other financial centers of the United States from the standpoint of an investment bank and in connection with the above fields of interest would be most helpful.

A REPORT ON THE EISENHOWER EXCHANGE FELLOWSHIP

by J.S. Pesmazoglu,
1954-55 Fellow from Greece

The following are some notes on a visit to the United States of America under the sponsorship of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships, Inc. This visit was originally planned for a period of about eight months, but had to be terminated at the end of about four and a half months as a result of an official recall to Athens. As outlined in "a statement of purpose" submitted to the Eisenhower Fellowships on arrival, I was anxious to use the opportunity which the Eisenhower Fellowship afforded me to obtain a first-hand knowledge of the American way of life, its characteristic features and tendencies, in addition to the more technical interests in economic planning and finance. The amount and intensity of experiences accumulated during this visit on a variety of fields of interest which I was anxious to cover hardly make possible at this stage more settled reflections.

An Account of the Visit

My wife and I arrived in New York on October 19, 1954, and we proceeded to Cambridge, Massachusetts, where the offices of the Eisenhower Fellowships were located at that time. Our stay in that city was used for the preparation of a more detailed program of our proposed visit. I believe that this was a helpful arrangement as it made possible the establishment of a first contact with a large American city while, at the same time, it provided an opportunity to become acquainted with the university institutions and life in the United States. Our stay in Cambridge lasted ten days (October 19-29), in the course of which I obtained some information of an academic character on the financial organization of this country. I also became acquainted with the teaching of economics and business administration in American universities. My contacts comprised discussions with the professors and administrative officers of the Graduate School of Business Administration and with the Department of Economics of the University of Harvard and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, as well as visits to the following organizations:

American Research and Development Corporation - as an example of a venture capital investment firm;

State Street Investment Corporation - as an example of an "open end" investment trust;

Arthur D. Little - an industrial research and consulting firm with considerable experience of work in foreign countries.

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During our stay in Cambridge and Boston, we also had many pleasant and informative contacts with university students and we visited museums and the principal places of historical interest in the area, including Plymouth. I must note that it was in Cambridge, Massachusetts that my wife and I attended for the first time an American, indeed a University, football match.

From Cambridge, Massachusetts, we went to Washington D.C. for about forty days (October 30 to December 8 1954) during which I tried to acquire some direct information on the organization, the procedures and principles of government policy-making and of administrative controls, especially in the fields of economics and finance. I have concentrated my attention during that period on certain aspects of central banking policy and supervision, in connection with which I followed fairly closely the work of an advance course organized for senior bank examiners by the Federal Reserve Board. During the greater part of our stay in Washington, I followed the work of the Federal Reserve Board, and had valuable discussions with the chairmen and the governors as well as with the senior officers of the staff. I also visited and had interesting discussions with the heads and the staff of the following United States Federal Government Departments and other Agencies:

- The Treasury;
- The Budget Bureau;
- The Department of State;
- The Foreign Operations Administration;
- The Import-Export Bank;
- The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development;
- The International Monetary Fund

During these visits, we discussed problems of organization and general policy, changes in financial techniques, the finance and administration of development projects in the United States and the promotion of economic progress in undeveloped areas of the world, the prospects and patterns of private American investment abroad and specific problems of particular interest to Greek economic development. During that period, very useful contacts and acquaintances were established with officials of the Federal Government and of other agencies and an inside view of life in the capital of the United States was obtained. This was supplemented by a number of interesting and pleasant visits to the remarkable art collections and places of national historic interest in Washington and its vicinity and by a number of informative tours through Virginia, including Richmond, Charlottesville and Williamsburg.

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A two-month stay in New York City followed the forty-day visit to Washington. Between December 8, 1954, and February 12, 1955, I tried to acquire some direct knowledge of the structure and procedures and of the prevailing attitudes in Wall Street through a series of visits to the following institutions:

The greater part of my time was employed in more concentrated visits to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York and to Smith, Barney & Company, since central and investment banking were the principal aspects of the financial organization in the United States on which I was interested to acquire more specific knowledge. The greater part of my work in Wall Street was therefore associated with the above two institutions, and I would like to emphasize the most valuable facilities which both of them have extended to me.

Our stay in New York has been an intense experience of working and living habits in this great city, as well as of its numerous and varied artistic manifestations and of the ample opportunities of meeting leading personalities in practically all fields of human activity. In this connection, I am anxious to emphasize the special interest and pleasure of becoming acquainted with a few of the leading American citizens associated with the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships and hearing directly from them their views, comments and suggestions, as well as their general attitudes and reactions to a number of current problems.

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On January 11, 1955, I joined in the privilege extended to the Eisenhower Fellows in being received by the President of the United States of America. I would like to restate my appreciation of the opportunity which the President of the United States was willing to extend to the Eisenhower Fellows despite the pressing demands on his time and efforts. No other manifestation could have been a stronger expression of the importance which President Eisenhower attaches to this Program.

By the middle of January a considerable amount of information and suggestions had been gathered, much of it from the trustees and officers of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships, indicating the main points which our visit should cover during the remaining approximate four-month period of our proposed stay in this country. A detailed program was in its final stages of preparation when I received instructions to return to Greece. These instructions were in connection with the change in the governors of the Bank of Greece, which took place in the latter part of January 1955. Attempts to delay our return for at least two months were ineffective, and it appeared clear that by the end of February, I would have to be in Athens. This caused the cancellation of a series of visits in a number of industrial plants, government agencies, financial institutions and banks throughout the United States. Due to the limitation of time, only a series of very brief visits in certain of the principal areas of the United States was possible, and accordingly, between Saturday, February 12th and Monday, February 28th, the following cities and places of interest were visited:

Philadelphia - Chester including visits to the Scott Paper Company and the Sun Oil Company Refinery

Arizona - Phoenix - The Grand Canyon

Southern California - Los Angeles including visits to Farmers and Merchants Bank of Los Angeles and to the film studios of 20th Century Fox Film Corporation and Walt Disney

San Francisco - the Muir Woods

Chicago including the Museum of Science and Industry

Buffalo - the Niagara Falls

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General Considerations on Our Visit

Through the contacts arranged by the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships, our stay in the United States made possible the accumulation of numerous experiences, leading to a deeper understanding of this country and of the American people. These experiences constitute at this moment a wealth of material which needs to be processed before any more mature comments could be expressed.

In the more technical fields of financial organization and methods of government and banking, I feel I have become better acquainted than ever before with American problems and practices. I am sure that this has strengthened not only my knowledge of American viewpoints on these matters but also my ability to understand why certain American methods can be applied in foreign countries while others cannot. I also feel that I have a greater appreciation of the technical characteristics and requirements of a highly developed industrial community. The opportunities and driving forces within the United States provide abundant evidence of the advantages of integrated geographic and economic areas.

I do not think that the above more technical information and reflections, however valuable they might be, constitute the most important gain of our visit. The opportunity of becoming acquainted with Americans of various groups and professions, with their living habits and reactions has been most important and revealing. This gives me the occasion to emphasize the friendly and sincere hospitality which my wife and I have enjoyed everywhere, even in those places where we stayed for only 24 hours. We shall always remember many and varied instances of new or renewed acquaintances which created additional ties of friendship in this country and gave us the most genuine insight into American life.

There are many remarkable features of living and working habits in this country which have drawn our attention and provided valuable material for thought. Such, for instance, are the following examples in the fields of industry, finance, and government: the widespread ownership of equities and the increasing participation of the lower income groups to the finance of the industry; the opportunity for promotion of persons of ability and the public spirit which one frequently meets among senior officers of private firms; the tendency towards bigger industrial and banking units; the active part of research in industry and the constant drive for technical and organizational improvements; the pioneering spirit which is present not only in the continuing conquest of new areas and resources within the United States, but also in most institutions, business organizations and scientific ventures; the difficulties and problems of coordination of the Government Departments and Agencies, Federal, State and local; the implications and influences on town planning and every-day living habits of the widespread use of motorcars.

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Beyond the above more technical features and problems of American life, I would like to emphasize my appreciation of the attention given to the display of works of art, musical performances, the organization of libraries, art collections and museums. It is also most interesting to notice the influences deriving from the widening use of certain new media such as television, long-playing records, and very good prints of painting masterpieces.

My wife and I shall always remember the deep impressions of the vastness and the immense variety of this land and its imposing scenery. I do not venture to pursue the thoughts induced by the impressive sights of the Grand Canyon, the Redwoods and Niagara Falls.

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Comments on the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships Program

I sincerely believe that this visit has been a unique opportunity to become acquainted with the United States and with the great variety, complexity, and vigor of American life. I can think of no improvement in the organizational arrangements of the Program. They have been very valuable in every possible way - flexible to be adaptable to new suggestions and changing situations and always ready to advise, supplement or amend the detailed plans of our visit. In all cases of contacts established under the sponsorship of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships, the arrangements have been of great assistance and have always lead to most valuable facilities. The friendly atmosphere created by the Trustees, the executive heads of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships, and their assistants, have been a decisive element for the success of the whole operation.

In this connection, I wish to express my appreciation of the opportunity which was provided under the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships for my wife to visit the United States with me. I can think of two main positive reasons in which this has contributed to a great extent to my visit. The presence of my wife enabled us to organize a nucleus of a home even in those places where we stayed for short periods. This gave us a fuller acquaintance with the day-to-day life of the American people. Secondly, while I was concentrating on the more technical fields of my professional interests, my wife was able to follow the other more general and artistic fields, and this enabled both of us to acquire a wider and fuller experience. I believe similar considerations would apply in the cases of other married Fellows.

I can therefore offer no suggestions for improvements in the administration of the Fellowships. I believe that the existing facilities are fully adequate to fulfill the objectives of the Program, especially if (a) emphasis is maintained on previous active practical experience in the selection of the Fellows, and (b) a permanent relationship is established between the Fellows and the Foundation under which contacts in the United States (or abroad) could be sponsored by the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships even after the termination of each Fellow's visit to the United States, or the respective country (or countries) of the world.

I would like to express my deep and very sincere thanks to the Trustees of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships, Inc., for the award of the Fellowship and for all the arrangements which made possible my wife's and my own visit to this country. I owe a special word of thanks to the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Mr. Thomas B. McCabe, and to Mr. Ward Wheelock and Mr. Clarence Francis for the interest which they have shown in our visit and for their kind and friendly assistance.

Dear Mr. Pesmazoglu:

I am a writer from Miami, Florida, in Washington for a year working on a book. I have been talking with J. Hampton Barnes of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships in Philadelphia about writing a magazine article on the fellowships. (I have been writing articles for several years; my most recent article appeared in the December 25, 1958, issue of The Reporter.) Mr. Barnes gave me your address and a number of others when I suggested that I would like information from some of the former fellows.

I am very much interested in your work as advisor to the Government of the Bank of Greece and to the Greek Government and would appreciate your answering the following questions:

1. Do you think that you would have become an advisor on monetary matters had you not been an Exchange Fellow?
2. Could you have done your job as well had you not been an Exchange Fellow?
3. Can you recall any specific program or method that you have helped introduce into banking and fiscal affairs in your country that is a direct result of your being an Eisenhower Exchange Fellow?
4. Have there been any specific programs or methods introduced into the European Free Trade Area negotiations, into the Greek Public Power Corporation procedures and operations, or into the work of NATO as a result of your work? If so, might any of your success in these endeavors be attributed to your fellowship experience?

As you can judge from these questions, I want to ascertain what direct effect the Fellowship has had on your activities, for I feel that the fellowship program is a great force for good work and leadership. I hope that you will answer these questions in the greatest detail.

I would also appreciate your writing a statement of a general nature letting me know about the progress of your career and what new ideas about life in the United States or the U.S. system you gained. If you are able to send clippings, or copies of clippings, they would be helpful. Both the New York Times Magazine and Reader's Digest are interested in this article, and I need as much information as I can get to write an acceptable article.

Dear Mr. Rivers,

I am sorry for the delay in answering your letter of January 31. I shall now try to give some answers to your questions and I hope these might be of some use.

1. It is very difficult to say whether I would have become The Economic Adviser of the Bank of Greece if I had not been an Eisenhower Exchange Fellow. What I can certainly say is that the experience which I have gained in the United States of America has much strengthened my qualifications and has certainly been of great value in shaping certain views and proposals which were probably useful to the Greek economic and monetary developments.

2. I believe that what I have said in the first question answers your second question. The knowledge and experience in the United States during my stay as an Eisenhower Exchange Fellow has been of the greatest value and has recently and in many ways made my contribution more substantial and helpful.

3. With respect to the third question, I think I can say that my work in central and commercial banking policies, on which I concentrated in recent years, was to a large extent influenced from my American experience, despite essential differences in the institutional framework and the degree of development between the two countries. Legislation on matters of treasury bills, the reorganisation of the securities market and instalment credit controls were also considerably influenced by my American experience in these and related fields. My acquaintance with certain banking practices in the United States, such as term lending and investment banking have greatly influenced my thoughts and advice. I finally wish to state more generally that my experience of the American financial and banking institutions and my direct contacts with leading representatives of the American business community has constituted a very precious background. My experience of American management and management techniques has frequently influenced my views as a Board Member of the Greek Public Power Corporation.

4. With respect to the fourth question I can certainly say that the advantages and the methods of the integrated American economic system have caused a great impression on me and certainly influenced

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my thoughts and arguments for the support of the case of Greece and other European countries and areas in progress of development during the negotiations for a unified European economy. My conviction that certain Central European policies are essential for the promotion of balanced economic growth in Europe as a whole, and for strengthening the "peripheral" areas of Europe have to a large extent been influenced by my experience of the relationship between Federal, state and regional action in the United States.

My final statement would be that I am deeply convinced that knowledge of certain aspects of the American life during my Eisenhower Fellowship constitutes a major element of success in my endeavours. In the present phase of developments in Western Europe the American experience is of the greatest value. It provides in many important aspects an indication as to what can and should be achieved within an integrated national life and in a unified system under centralised administration. These considerations provide a powerful argument in support of the efforts and developments towards the creation of the United States of Europe.

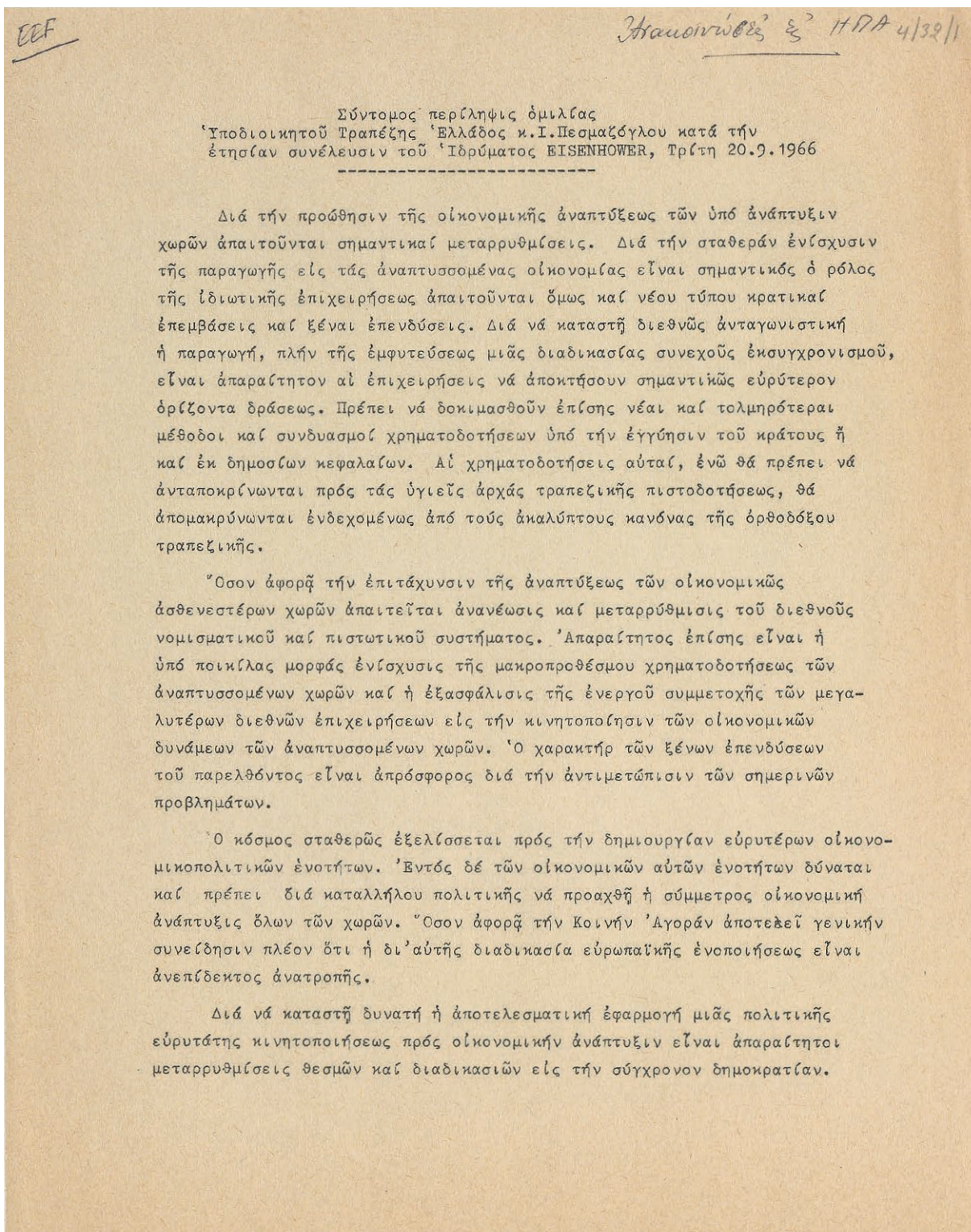

Εις την έτησινήν όμιλιν ο κ. Πεσμαζόγλου έτόνισεν την ανάγκην βασιικών μεταρρυθμίσεων εις τους θεσμούς καί τάς κατευθύνσεις πολιτικής διά νά εξασφαλισθ ή επιτυχής προαγωγή της οικονομικής αναπτύξεως εις τό πλαίσιον της κοινοβουλευτικής δημοκρατίας καί έπεσήμανε τέσσαρα πεδία όπου μία ενεργός ανανεωτική καί μεταρρυθμιστική προσέθεσις είναι αναγκαία καί επείγουσα.

Τό πρώτον πεδιον τό όποιον έπεσήμανεν ο Υποδιοικητής της Τραπεζής της Ελλάδος είναι ο ρόλος της ιδιωτικής επιχειρήσεως καί ή ανάγκη νέου τύπου κρατικών επεμβάσεων καί ζήτων επενδύσεων διά την ένίσχυσιν καί τόν έκσυγχρονισμόν της παραγωγής εις τάς αναπτυσσομένας χώρας. Διά νά επιτευχθ ή εις τάς χώρας αυτές άπαραίτητος ανταγωνιστικότης της παραγωγής, ειπεν ο κ. Πεσμαζόγλου, πλίν της έμπροσθεν μιης διαδικασίας συνεχούς εκσυγχρονισμού είναι ανάγκη νά αποκτήσουν αι επιχειρήσεις σημαντικώς εύρύτερον όρίζοντα δράσεως τόσον ως προς τόν χώρον όσον καί ως προς τόν χρόνον. Δέν είναι τούτο εύκολον εις τάς οικονομικώς ασθενεστεράς χώρας, άνευ εύρύτερας αναδιοργανώσεως καί σημαντικών χρηματοδοτικών ενισχύσεων από εξειδι-

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νευμένους οργανισμούς, έθνικούς και διεθνείς. Είναι ανάγκη να δοκιμασθούν, είτε, νέαι και τολμηρότεροι μέθοδοι και συνδυασμοί χρηματοδοτήσεων υπό την έγγυήσιν του κράτους ή και έπι δημοσίων κεφαλαίων και τούτο τόσο εν εσωτερικώς, εις τας έπι μέρους χώρας, όσο και διεθνώς. Αι χρηματοδοτήσεις αυτές, εν ώ δά πρέπει να ανταποκρίνονται προς τας υγιείς αρχάς τραπεζικής πιστοδοτήσεως, θα έπομακρύνονται ένδεχομένως από τας αβετηροτέρας μεθόδους της έρθουδίου τραπεζικής.

Τό δεύτερον πεδόν που έπασχμανεν ο κ. Ίσοδιουητής και όπου έπίσης έπαιτείται ανανέωσις και μεταρρυθμίσις είναι τό διεθνές νομισματικόν και πιστωτικόν σύστημα. Εξάρν του προβλήματος διεθνούς ρευστότητος, ως προς τό όποιον αι διεξαγόμεναι συζητήσεις είναι ανάγκη τεχέως να όλοκληρωθούν, έπαραίτητος είναι και ή παράλληλος ένλοχυσίς της μακροπροόδου χρηματοδοτήσεως υπό κοινής μορφής των αναπτυσσομένων χωρών και ή εξασφάλισις της ένεργου συμμετοχής των μεγάλων διεθνών έπιχειρήσεων εις τήν κινήσοψήσιν των οικονομικών δυνάμεων των αναπτυσσομένων χωρών. Ο χαρακτήρ των ξένων έπενδύσεων του παρελθόντος είναι άπρόσφορος διά τήν αντιμετώπισιν των σημερινών προβλημάτων. Άντί της έπιδίδεως είδικου και μεγάλου κέρδους είναι άναγκαία ή δημιουργία έπιοικοδομητικών και μονίμων κοινοπρασιών με τας έπιχειρηματικές δυνάμεις και τό εύρύτερα στρώματα του πληθυσμού εις τας αναπτυσσομένας χώρας. Τοιούτου είδους γόνιμοι πρωτοβουλίαί έπαιτούνται εις πολύ μεγαλύτεραν ένταση παρά όσον έξετηλόθησαν κατά τά τελευταία έτη, ή δέ έπιτυχής άνάληψις των παραλλήλων προς τήν προαγωγήν της διεθνούς πιστωτικής και οικονομικής συνεργασίας έποτελεί μίαν άισθη προϋπόθεσιν διά τήν ανανέωσιν και ένλοχυσιν της δημοκρατίας κατά τρόπον ανταποκρινόμενον προς τας άνάγκας και τας προσδοκίας των αναπτυσσομένων χωρών.

Τό τρίτον πεδόν όπου έπαιτούνται και έπέρχονται έπίσης σημαντικά έλλαγαί είναι ό σχηματισμός οικονομικών ένόσεων εν περισσότερων χωρών. Ο κόσμος βαθίζει, ειπεν ο κ. Πεσμαζόγλου, προς τήν διαμόρφωσιν μεγάλων οικονομικοπολιτικών ένότητων. Είναι όμως ουσίώδες έγκαίριος έντις των ένότητων αυτών να διαμορφωθή μία ένιαία και δραστηνή πολιτική ανάπτυξεως, κυρία έπιδιεύσις της όποίας θα είναι ή σύμμετρος και άρμονική άνάπτυξις των συμμετεχουσών χωρών και των έπι μέρους περιφερειών των. Άναφερόμενος είδικώς εις τήν Κοινήν Άγοράν ο κ. Πεσμαζόγλου παρατήρησεν ότι έποτελεί γενικήν συναίσθησιν πλέον ότι ή διαδικασία οικονομικής ένοποιήσεως εις τήν Εύρώπην είναι

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ανεπίδεκτος ανατροπής, οδηγεί δε κατ' ανάγκην και προς την πολιτικήν ένοποίησην. 'Η δημιουργία μιᾶς οικονομικῆς και πολιτικῆς ηνωμένης Εβρώπης θά ενισχύσῃ αποφασιστικῶς τὰς δυνάμεις τῆς ἐλευθερίας, τῆς εἰρήνης και τῆς προόδου. 'Αλλ' αἱ σκοποὶ αὗτοι θά ἐξυπηρετηθοῦν μόνον ἐάν οὐσιῶδες στοιχεῖον τῶν προσπαθειῶν αὐτῶν εἶναι ἡ πλήρης κινητοποίηση τῶν ἀνθρωπίνων και ὀλικῶν παραγωγικῶν πόρων ὅλων τῶν εἰς τὴν Κοινότητα συμμετεχουσῶν χωρῶν.

'Αλλο σημαντικόν πεδῖον ἀνανεώσεων και μεταρρυθμίσεων εἶναι ἡ ὀργάνωσις τοῦ σύγχρονου δημοκρατικῆς κράτους, εἶπεν ὁ κ. Πεσμαζόγλου. Θεμέλιον τοῦ 19ου αἰῶνος ἀπετέλεσεν ἡ διαιρέσις τῶν τριῶν βασικῶν ἐξουσιῶν, ἡτοι τῆς νομοθετικῆς, ἐκτελεστικῆς και δικαστικῆς. Ἐξήμερον ἀπαιτοῦνται περισσότεραι ανεξάρτητοι διαδικασίαι, ἡπλαθὲ νέων και πληρέστερον σύστημα ἰσορροπητικῶν μηχανισμῶν διὰ νὰ ἀνταποκριθοῦν ἐπιτυχῶς τὰ σύγχρονα κρήτη εἰς τὴν μεγάλην ἀποστολήν τῆς οικονομικῆς και κοινωνικῆς προόδου. Dear Mr. McCabe,

I am sorry for the delay in writing to you personally after our return from the United States. During the last two months we have been busy trying to reorganize our family life and my work which has been confined, since our return, to the post of Director and Economic Adviser of the Bank of Greece (which is our Central Bank).

I do not know if you remember that in the very pleasant evening at the Barnes's, last February, you asked me which were the things which impressed me most in the United States. It was difficult at that time to master the wealth of experiences which were accumulating during our stay and series of visits in the United States. I may now be more able to answer your question. I believe that among the many very valuable things with which my wife and I were very fortunate to become acquainted in your country perhaps the most impressive has been the intense drive for improvement and progress and the constant search for better and more effective solutions to all problems. I think we found this attitude everywhere. This has left a deep and lasting impression on us, which prevails the mass of experiences, information and knowledge which we brought back home from the United States. I am also anxious to inform you that the more technical information on the set up of the Federal Economic Departments and on the structure and functioning of the financial and banking organization have been most valuable experiences from which important elements are already influencing my thoughts and my work.

My wife and I frequently remember our very interesting and informative visit to the Scott Paper Co. and the day we spent with you. Our discussion before and during lunch time and what you told us about your methods of running this big and progressive firm were most revealing.

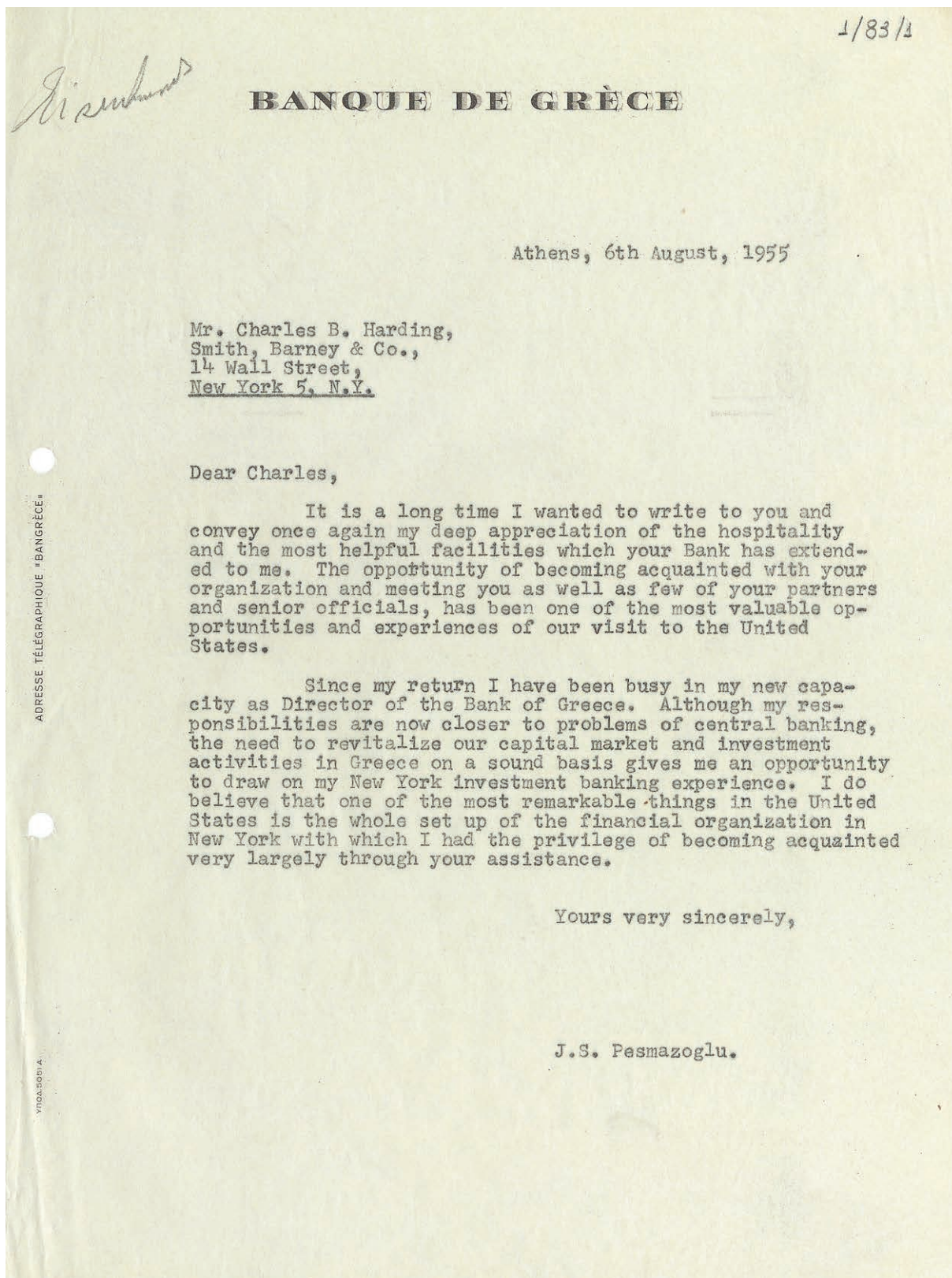

EISENHOWER FELLOWSHIPS GRANTED FREE WORLD CITIZENS

CAMBRIDGE, Massachusetts -- The Eisenhower Exchange Fellowship program, designed to give specialized training to men and women of high caliber, starts this year with 13 potential administrative and creative leaders who are coming to the United States from overseas.

The program was established last year by American business and professional leaders as a 63rd birthday present to President Dwight D. Eisenhower "for his contributions to humanity as a soldier, statesman, and one of the world's great leaders."

With the belief that training in leadership is a positive force for international friendship, the program offers fellowships to citizens of all free nations, including the United States.

In choosing the holders of these fellowships, the Executive Committee of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships first designates the countries whose development needs can best be supplied by the skills and educational resources of the United States. Then it selects from each of these countries persons of exceptional ability and promise who are working in the fields of their

countries' greatest needs. At an average cost of about \$10,000 each, they are brought to the United States for a year of travel, consultation with experts, practical on-the-job training, and post-graduate college work if needed.

During 1954-55, 13 top men will come to the United States from Brazil, Chile, Free China, the Gold Coast, Greece, India, Israel, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Pakistan, Thailand and Turkey to study subjects that will include teaching methods in technical schools, railroad maintenance, banking operations, soil conservation and restoration, increased production of corn, management of pulp and paper plants, and hydro-electric installations and equipment.

Future plans call for expansion of the program to 75 fellowships a year, a number of which will be awarded to Americans for study in other lands.

On the occasion of the first public announcement of the program, President Eisenhower said: "Overshadowing everything with which we deal today is the question of...international relationships of friendship. Knowledge itself is not enough. What we need is understanding, and this understanding will come from these young men and women as they go back and forth between our country and others. They will carry understanding, an understanding of America's heart: that she wants peace."

Dear Fellow:

We thought that many of you would like to have word of what is going on in the lives of former Eisenhower Exchange Fellows. These notes have been taken from letters that have come in from a number of Fellows who have written us from their homes during the past six months. It is our idea to send you such a news letter from time to time as similar information comes in to us. It is also our hope that this letter will encourage you to drop us a line occasionally giving news of you and your family.

We feel that the Eisenhower Fellows were such warm friends of ours and of each other during their stay in the United States that we want to continue that friendship through the medium of these Fellowship notes.

We also enclose a list of the 1956 Fellows so that you may see who your successors are.

Frederick Arkhurst - Gold Coast

August 30, 1955: "I have received notification from the Gold Coast Government that I have been selected for training for the future Gold Coast External Affairs Service. It has therefore become necessary for me to leave by air for London where I shall be attached to the British Foreign Office for six weeks while attending a course for Commonwealth diplomatic cadets. Thereafter I shall proceed to Rome where I will be attached to the British Embassy for another six months before I finally return to the Gold Coast." Mr. Arkhurst is now in Rome.

Muhammad Ayub - Pakistan

October 3, 1955: "You will be pleased to know that I have been appointed as a full-time Director of the Pakistan Industrial Development Corporation. This is a Government-financed institution which was set up January 1952 to assist in the promotion of industries which private enterprise was unable, or unwilling, to develop on its own. During these three years, the P.I.D.C. has played a very prominent part in the industrial development of Pakistan. Its total investments have been estimated at over 600 million rupees (approximately 150 million dollars), of which about one-third is private capital and the balance consists of Government investments, foreign aid and international bank loans.

"The post of Director ranks in status and pay with that of a Secretary to the Government of Pakistan. The Chairman of the Board is a former Secretary of the Ministry of Industries, while the other Directors are three of Pakistan's leading businessmen and industrialists. But, apart from the increase in pay and responsibility, this appointment gives me an opportunity of applying some of the lessons which I learnt during my ten months' stay in the United States under the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowship."

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Gabriel Baldovinos de la Pena - Mexico

October 6, 1955: "I have resumed my duties at the Technical Department at the Corn Commission and tonight the Eisenhower Fellowships Selection Committee will give a little dinner on account of my return.

"I have not had time to appraise the agricultural situation of Mexico yet. The evidences indicate that my training will be put into good use for the betterment of our agriculture."

Felix Sin Yah Chang - Formosa

November 23, 1955: "My wife and I arrived safely in Taiwan and I resumed my work the very next day. I have been kept busy from morning till night, with lots of social functions after business hours. In addition to regular office work, I have to learn the changes in foreign exchange regulations that happened during my absence. The International Monetary Fund sent a mission here for annual consultation and I was one of the delegates, which took me away from my desk for almost two weeks. Then came the fellow bankers from the States. All in all, I had a really rough and tumble time.

"During this extremely busy period, I still managed to speak at both the Taipei and Chilung Rotary Clubs, and I have made four other speeches. I am organizing an informal research group among the staff of my Foreign Department to encourage them to learn the various new phases of banking that I learned from the States. My thinking is to spread whatever I have learned to those who did not have the opportunity. USIS here asked me for an interview and made two recordings, one in English and the other in Chinese, which were both broadcasted here in the Voice of America."

Suleyman Demirel - Turkey

September 27, 1955: "I thought you would be pleased to hear that I have been promoted to the post of Acting Director General of State Hydraulic Works Department. This is the parent organization of Dams Division which I have been heading. I have been assigned to give a new shape and spirit to this organization. State Hydraulic Works Department is engaged in the development of natural resources, namely, water, power and land.

"I am sure that my study in the United States on the subject of the management of natural resource development will be most helpful to me. I have the determination to be successful and I will do my best. I have immensely enjoyed the study and I am confident that this study will be very helpful to me and to my country which is a strong member of the free world."

Enrique Edwards Orrego - Chile

October 20, 1955: "I had a very pleasant trip home with a stop over for a week in Lima, and went right to work. During the last few weeks some changes have taken place in my office and as a result of them I am now in charge of the operations. A decisive consideration for this promotion has been the experiences collected in the United States as an Eisenhower Fellow."

November 3, 1955: "I have been nominated Manager of our Metallurgical Manufacturers Association. Enclosed you will find the information concerning this designation which appeared in the Chilean newspapers, and also the interview about the general impressions from the United States received as an Eisenhower Fellow. The problem is that after one year abroad a tremendous amount of work gives me little time for lectures and interviews describing the United States. However a full schedule is already now going on and permanently I am talking about the things I saw in the States (and which so much enthusiasm developed in me) trying to promote a better understanding of this country in Chile."

Jose Pedreira de Freitas - Brazil

December 19, 1955: "Formal lectures, speeches, interviews and final examinations at our Escoba Politecnica have required my close attention after my return from your extraordinary country.

"As I told you while still in New York, the Governor of our State (Bahia) invited me to be his Director of the State Department of Commerce and Industries. Upon my return, I discussed very thoroughly with him his kind invitation and we agreed that it would be very much more fruitful to our State - due to my experiences as an Eisenhower Fellow - to be the General (Executive) Secretary of the new ambitious program of his government named "Comissao de Planejamento Economico" (C.P.E.). This program is indeed a magnificent effort to start something new in our State, a general planning for our whole economy, responsible for directing the government and, to a certain extent, private investment in the next five years. It will deal with all our basic and vital projects - such as transportation and communications, agriculture, rural electrification and irrigation, immigration and colonisation, etc., and - which makes it different from similar programs in the Country - a special emphasis will be given to the private management of the future projects leaving to direct State administration only the basic enterprises which by their own nature cannot attract the private interest. We are working very hard on some special projects which may give some 'momentum' to the entire program and I am very likely to see you again very soon.

"I am planning a special brochure in English about the possibilities for foreign investments in our area and as soon as I have it ready I shall be very pleased to forward it to you."

Yonosuke Goto - Japan

October 23, 1955: "After the return home, I contributed several articles to Japanese influential newspapers, in order to propagate correct understanding of American economic strength. I broadcast my opinion on the radio too....I am now polishing up the draft of my new book on the U. S. economy." Mr. Goto enclosed numerous newspaper clippings.

October 28, 1955: "I am now making efforts to correct misunderstanding of American economic strength by Japanese. There arises opinion that it was wrong to see American economy with Russians' eyes...."

November 22, 1955: "Recently, invited by business associations of Osaka, second largest city of Japan, I delivered several speeches on economic strength of American economy. At the same time, Prof. W. S. Woytinsky of John Hopkins University and Dr. W. L. Thorp, formerly Under Secretary of State Department, visited there and gave lectures on the same problems.... The Mainichi (one of the nation-wide leading newspapers) review of these lectures is of some interest, for it comparatively introduces different opinions on the cyclical movements of American economy, Mr. Ogura, member of the Board of Directors of World Economic Institute, on the pessimistic side, and Prof. Woytinsky and myself on the optimistic.... Since my return here I have kept busy, not a week having passed without some lectures or speeches relating, in some way or other, to my study in the United States."

January 3, 1956: "My home journey has been a very pleasant one. Now I am enjoying the warmth of my family and the fine weather of Campobasso, my home town. Unfortunately this will not last very long because on January 10 I shall go to Rome and define with Mr. Ogg, the Agricultural Attache, the conditions for my eventual employment by the American Embassy. On this occasion I will get in touch with Mrs. Luce's secretary in order to know when I can be received by Her Excellency."

David Moushine - Israel

January 15, 1956: "We had a very pleasant trip, never missed a train and never lost any of the twenty-odd pieces of luggage we dragged across from one continent through a second and onto a third.

"I visited the Prime Minister's Office to present myself and had a very pleasant reception, and as far as they were concerned I could have sat down and started work there and then...Within the next week I will have to decide with them what I will be doing....There are several quite interesting suggestions."

John S. Pasmazoglu - Greece

March 17, 1955: "Our return trip has been pleasant and we safely arrived in Athens where our children and families were all well. I was quite busy during our first days in trying to become informed of the developments since my departure. I shall now assume full responsibilities in my capacity as an advisor to the Bank of Greece and I shall accordingly resign from my position as Director General of the Ministry of Coordination. I believe that my acquaintance with banking practices in the United States will be particularly valuable in my work with our central Bank.

"I had long conversations with the American Ambassador in Athens and with other officials of your Embassy and your Economic Mission. I tried to convey to all of them the significance of the Eisenhower Fellowships."

May 21, 1955: "It was a very great pleasure for us to be able to greet and welcome in Athens Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Francis and, later on, Mr. and Mrs. Barnes who stayed for a couple of days in Greece on their way from Turkey to Egypt. In addition to the exceptional pleasure, these visits gave us the feeling that we are still not too far away from the United States and that we might be seeing our good American friends."

Chalong Pungtrakul - Thailand

September 28, 1955: "My wife and I reached Bangkok safely. We spent a few days in Honolulu and Tokyo on the way and enjoyed both places very much.

"As soon as I got back to Bangkok, I had to untangle much unfinished business in my office. At the same time, I was told to make preparations for the Colombo Plan meeting in Singapore which I was to attend. I am now in Singapore participating in the meeting which will last about one month."

Akhoury Sitanath - India

August 21, 1955: "Urmila and I arrived after an exceedingly pleasant and comfortable journey. We had a very interesting time on board ship and enjoyed the week we spent in London renewing old contacts and associations. I am still on leave, spending the time with my father and family, and expect to resume work with the Railway shortly. You will be happy to know that my father, who had been extremely unwell for a couple of months while I was away, has now completely recovered. The children are also very well.

"My address from now on should be: District Mechanical Engineer, North Eastern Railway, Alipur Duar, West Bengal, India."

New York—Election of eight new members to the Board of Trustees of Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships, Inc., was announced today by Thomas B. McCabe, Chairman of the Board.

Mr. McCabe, who is President of the Scott Paper Company, Chester, Pa., and former Chairman of the Federal Reserve Board, said the new trustees are Charles B. Harding, Senior Partner, Smith, Barney & Company, and W. Alton Jones, Chairman, Cities Service Company, both of New York; Theodore V. Houser, Chairman, Sears, Roebuck & Company, and John L. McCaffrey, President, International Harvester Company, both of Chicago; Justin W. Dart, President, Rexall Drug Company, and Jesse W. Tapp, Chairman, Bank of America, both of Los Angeles; Theodore S. Petersen, President, Standard Oil Company of California, San Francisco, and Joseph P. Spang, Jr., Chairman, Gillette Company, Boston.

Mr. McCabe also announced that the number of countries designated to send Fellows to the United States has been increased from 13 to 15 for 1957. The Selection Committee, headed by S. C. Allyn, President of National Cash Register Company, Dayton, named the following countries: Argentina, Burma, Chile, Greece, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Israel, Italy, Korea, Morocco, Peru, Philippine Islands, Saudi Arabia and Sudan.

Candidates for Eisenhower Fellowships from these countries will be handpicked men between the ages of 35 and 45 who have attained a high degree of achievement and success in their own chosen field, said Mr. McCabe. They will be drawn from the area of their country's greatest need, he stated, and will spend a year in the United States learning our management techniques and our American way of life.

The Fellowship was established in 1953 as a gift to President Dwight D. Eisenhower.

The Selection Committee of Greece, when appointed and assembled, should meet with you to receive their instructions. They should be charged (1) with choosing the field in industry, government or the professions where Greece's greatest need or interest lies, and (2) with the nomination of two or three individuals of promise of leadership and proven ability. These nominees will then fill out application forms which we will supply to you for the committee. The completed applications should be forwarded to us in duplicate for consideration by our Trustees' Selection Committee in this country. A final, single selection will be made by them. Since the ultimate responsibility for the appointment of a Fellow rests with us, it is essential that the Committee in Greece send us at least two nominations. As soon as the Trustees' Selection Committee makes the designation, we will cable you so that you may notify the chosen candidate. We will send him a letter of instruction with regard to his transportation and other matters, copy of which will go to you.

I enclose a brochure describing the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships, their origin, their goals, and their method of functioning as well as a list of the 1957 Fellows and a sample application form. Additional copies of these and other descriptive materials are being mailed to you under separate cover by air express for distribution to the members of the committee. We will send additional application forms as they may be needed.

For your further information, I would like to stress the fact that the success of the Eisenhower Fellowships program has been due to the quality and calibre of those selected for this award. One Fellow only is selected from each country; he must be a man or woman of demonstrated leadership qualities. While we state that the selection of the Fellow should be from a professional, governmental or industrial field which is important in the development of the future of his country, I want to make it clear that our program is not one of technical aid. No specific study or line of work will be assigned or contemplated although, if the Fellow desires, some short courses at a university may be arranged and included in his program.

The program itself is arranged after the arrival of the Fellow in the United States and is the result of many discussions between the Executive Director and the Fellow; a close collaboration intended to evolve a profitable and imaginative experience for the Fellow. We arrange interviews with a number of individuals prominent in industry, education and government. We want each Fellow to see our country and meet our people. We want him to observe American attitudes and ideas in a variety of areas and on many different levels; the ultimate objective being to have an Eisenhower Fellow know America through his own experience here. The program we propose is not propaganda nor is it devised to sell America, but rather to have each Fellow form his own conclusions about our country and its citizens in the light of his personal observation, to the mutual benefit of both his country and ours in his future work.

We believe this program is unique since it is not a student program nor are candidates chosen by examination. Candidates must be of leadership calibre, preferably between the ages of 30 and 45, having a reasonably fluent speaking and writing knowledge of English. We emphasize the matter of facility in English since the Fellows are in constant contact with high echelons in business, government and education; which contacts would be virtually pointless unless the Fellow was able to understand and express himself clearly in English.

Our program permits the wife of an appointed Fellow to accompany him to the United States provided she has the necessary qualifications to benefit by such a visit, including a reasonably fluent knowledge of English. The Fellowships underwrite all transportation costs for man and wife both to and from a Fellow's country and also while travelling in the United States. In addition, we pay each Fellow a monthly maintenance allowance to cover board and lodging expenses while in this country. This allowance amounts to \$450 per month for a single man and \$700 per month for a Fellow accompanied by his wife. The term of the Fellowship is approximately ten months. We do not want a Fellow to come here unless he is able and willing to stay a minimum of eight months.

It is possible that a Fellow's wife may not be able to accompany him nor stay the full term of his Fellowship. In several instances, wives have arranged to come here after their husbands or to precede them home. These arrangements are entirely agreeable to us provided the wife is actually in the United States for a period not less than three months. We are compelled to draw a strict line with regard to children, however, barring them from accompanying their parents to the United States. We have found from experience that, when a Fellow and his wife have children with them on a Fellowship, the necessary care and attention to their children interferes with the movement of a Fellow and his wife around the country and prevents them from mingling freely with individuals and groups beneficial to their program. Moreover, a Fellow's program includes visits to all parts of the United States, consequently a great deal of travel is required. This important aspect of the program is virtually nullified if children accompany their parents.

It is our hope to receive nominations from the foreign Selection Committee via your Embassy by July 15, 1957. We hope to have a Fellow leave his country in ample time to arrive in the United States sometime during October, with a firm deadline of November 1, 1957. Form of travel is optional, though air is preferred to save time.

We are calling on Greece's Ambassador in Washington to apprise him of the designation of Greece to send an Eisenhower Fellow to the United States for 1958 and also to describe to him the method of selection which we have outlined above.

General Information Regarding the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships

In honor of Dwight D. Eisenhower, President of the United States of America, this program of Exchange Fellowships has been set up and paid for by citizens of the United States.

As to Fellows coming to the United States, a specially designed program adapted to each individual Fellow will be arranged for the following purposes:

1. To choose potential leaders who, through work already performed in their own countries, have proved themselves to possess leadership qualities with a capacity for growth.
2. To provide an opportunity for a Fellow to observe and discuss techniques and practices in his particular field with those especially qualified in that field in the United States, thus making him better able to serve the interests of his own country on his return home;
3. To enable each Fellow, through experience in different parts of the United States and in different activities, to develop an understanding and appreciation of the people of this country, so that he may better interpret to his own country the aims and actions of the United States.

Foreign Fellows will be chosen from selected countries in the field decided by a local Eisenhower Fellowships Selection Committee. Application forms may be secured from and must be filed with the local Eisenhower Fellowships Selection Committee. Completed applications will be forwarded in duplicate to the United States Eisenhower Fellowships Selection Committee.

A Fellow's wife is invited to accompany him on his Fellowship provided she has a reasonably fluent knowledge of the English language and remains in the United States a minimum of three months.

A Fellow may not be accompanied by children on his Fellowship in the United States.

Qualifications for an Eisenhower Exchange Fellow:

He or she must:

1. Be a citizen of the country from which chosen.
2. Be in a vitally important field in his country's economy.
3. Have worked a sufficient time to have proved potential leadership.
A college education is not necessary.
4. Have good health, certified by a physician on attached form.

5. Have a good working knowledge of English, both spoken and written.
6. Have character, decency and integrity.
7. Agree to remain in the United States for the duration of a Fellowship program with a minimum stay of eight months.
8. Agree to return to his or her country at the end of the Fellowship period. In this connection, we feel we should draw your attention to the following excerpt from a circular from the Department of State, Washington, D. C., regarding Public Law 555, 84th Congress, amending section 201 of Public Law 402, 80th Congress.

"...It will require all foreign nationals entering the United States as exchange visitors...to remain abroad two years following their exchange visits before re-entering the United States for permanent residence or as non-immigrants to perform temporary services or labor...."

General Outline of Program:

1. A Fellowship with a term of eight to ten months with all travel and maintenance expenses paid.

Maintenance allowance is \$450.00 per month for a bachelor or a Fellow unaccompanied by his wife. The allowance for a Fellow while he is accompanied by his wife is \$700.00 per month.

2. There is no specific grant of money.
3. Each Fellow's program will take him to many parts of the United States where he can meet men in his field and learn practical problems and answers. The Executive Director will formulate each program in collaboration with the Fellow.
4. Visits will be arranged to various parts of the United States; each Fellow will meet Americans at work and at home. He will not matriculate at a university nor take a degree, but certain special short seminars may be scheduled.
5. Our purpose is to give experience to potential leaders, and to have them, through observation and travel, understand America.
6. Fellows will meet leading men at all levels; working, planning, directing. Their visits to men or plants will not be perfunctory; they will have sufficient time to form an understanding of problems that confront American businessmen.

Dear John:

When I received the communication from the Greek Consul General in New York about the decoration from the Greek government, I thought that you had been responsible for it, and am very grateful to you for your kind thought of me. As you know, we consider you one of our outstanding Eisenhower Fellows and will always be grateful to you for the special trip you made to address the Trustees and Sponsors of the program.

I presume you heard that four of our Eisenhower Fellows are included in the Cabinet of the new government in Argentina. In talking with former Vice President Nixon a short time ago, he told me that he was deeply impressed with the ability and competence of the Eisenhower Fellows in Argentina and wanted me to pass this word along to General Eisenhower. The recognition which has been accorded the Fellows in various countries of the world gives us renewed hope in the future of the program.

The Ford Foundation, which had limited their contribution to the program to the first ten years, had a change of heart and have come back with a three-year renewal of support by pledging us a total of \$150,000. They did this after a complete and thorough analysis of the program which had been made by an outside agency and with the first-hand knowledge of several of the

EEF CELEBRATES TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY

October 13, 1973, marks the twentieth anniversary of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships. It was on that date, twenty years ago, that the newly-chartered organization was presented to President Eisenhower as a birthday tribute at a party in his honor at Hershey, Pennsylvania.

The idea of the Fellowships had been developed by a group of his friends and supporters who wanted to make the President's 63rd birthday — his first in the White House — a memorable occasion. Of the five original "incorporators", three continue to serve on the Board of Trustees: Thomas B. McCabe, Chairman Emeritus of EEF and former Chairman of Scott Paper Company; Philip T. Sharples, former Chairman of The Sharples Corporation; and Walter H. Annenberg, United States Ambassador to the Court of St. James's.

After an intensive survey of the existing fellowship field, the idea emerged of breaking away from the usual, academic awards and developing a program which would be unique. Hence, the distinctive features of the Eisenhower Fellowships, as a program for men and women in *mid-career*, were decided upon.

In the summer of 1954, the first group of thirteen Fellows arrived in the United States and three Americans traveled abroad. From these small beginnings, the number of Fellows has grown to more than five hundred in eighty-four countries of the world.

In his memoirs, *Mandate for Change*, President Eisenhower recalled how he had been given "possibly the most splendid birthday present I have ever received." After describing the Hershey party, he added:

"But the real significance of the evening was the announcement of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships. They were established to finance extended visits to and from the United States, not by students or men and women exclusively in the academic world, but rather by outstanding people in mid-career from a variety of fields. . . . This non-partisan program of broad scope is one of the few two-way international exchanges not financed by the government. . . . It was fine to feel on that birthday evening so many were expressing in such a practical way their faith in promotion of understanding among peoples everywhere, of whatever station, as one basis for achieving mankind's greatest goal, peace with justice."

JHB's LETTER TO THE BULLETIN



Dear Fellows,

By the time this *Bulletin* reaches you, the 1973 Fellowship year will have come to a close. The Fellows this year (and I suspect I have said this before about all the Fellows over the past twenty years) are a tremendously able and articulate group. The 1973 program was also enlivened by the presence of Vasily Gromeka, our first Fellow from the Soviet Union. Vasily is Chief of the Scientific and Technical Progress Section at the Institute of U.S. Studies, Academy of Sciences of the U.S.S.R. Throughout his time here, and especially at the two Seminars, Philadelphia and Aspen, Vasily aroused the admiration of all of us by his clarity of thought and expression. We hope to have more Soviet Fellows in the future.

On October 13, 1973, the Eisenhower Fellowships will reach its 20th birthday. As I write this letter, there are now some five hundred men and women around the world in eighty-four countries who have come to know the United States through the medium of

our program. Many of you, I am sure, will agree that your experience here has had a strong impact on your life and work. For our part, we can say with immense satisfaction that *our* sense of achievement has come directly from all of you. You have given us your friendship, your confidence and your patient good humor. Further, we have learned much about human nature and the problems that beset the developing nations across the past two decades. We like to think we have provided substance and guidance to all of you who are influential in directing the destinies of your countries. This has been our continuing purpose and will be in the future.

Early in July, I made a short, intensive visit to Greece and Israel; about five days in each country. You know, of course, the general state of affairs in Greece. What you may not know is that two of our Fellows were being held in prison in Athens "under investigation"; namely, John Pasmazoglu (1955) and Nicholas Athanassiadis (1964). I do not need, nor is this the proper place, to express my sadness at this unhappy state of affairs. It is sufficient to say that not until the countries of the world embrace the concept of freedom of elections and of complete national self-determination will humanity be able to move toward a condition of human happiness and a level of progress and equal opportunity for all. For obvious reasons I cannot describe my activities or efforts on behalf of our Greek friends. [Note: On August 22nd, the New York Times carried a

news story telling of the release from prison of John Pasmazoglu, Nicholas Athanassiadis and other political prisoners.]

In Israel I saw the achievements of that country's first twenty-five years of existence and they are magnificent! Thanks to our 1955 Fellow, David Moushine, I met a number of leaders in government, education and the arts. Moreover, Doris and David Moushine gave a charming and informative dinner which was attended by nearly all our former Israeli Fellows. The entire visit was superbly planned; I enjoyed it immensely.

In 1974, EEF will see some changes. The period of the Fellowship will be somewhat curtailed. We have found that many of the potential candidates submitted by the Selection Committees are not able to absent themselves for as long as six months and for that reason we have cut down the period of stay in the United States to three to five months. In this way we feel we will be able to continue the high standards of the participants on the program.

I send you my warmest and most personal greetings. The great EEF family continues to grow both in size and strength. I consider myself fortunate to count so many splendid men and women as my close friends.

Following the meeting of last Thursday on the selection of the 1956-57 Eisenhower Fellow for Greece I would like to submit the following for your consideration. I should perhaps add that I have given previous thought to the matter in the spring of 1955, when on my return from the United States I was asked by the then Cultural Attache of your Embassy Mr. W. Weld whether I had any suggestion about the selection of the next Eisenhower Fellow, whenever of course Greece were to be asked again to nominate a Fellow. I have then indicated the fields which I am suggesting below and the first of the three possible candidates, the names of which I now submit to you.

I believe that we should do our utmost to strengthen scientific or economic applied research in combination with government administration or industrial management. I am aware that this is a rather general and inadequately specific description. But it covers such fields as agricultural, geological or technological research with special reference to Greek problems and in conjunction with the organisation of the application and utilisation of the results of such research for the benefit of production and in support of the economic development of the country. I believe, however, that what the Ambassador said at the last meeting in connection with the choice of the fields of greatest importance is very true and relevant.

In the light of the above I would like to submit the following names for consideration.

I. Mr. Kyriakos Zachos - Director General of the Greek Institute of Geological and Subsurface Research. Between 40 and 45 - married. Very successful studies in physics and mathematics at the University of Athens followed by a period of research (including doctorate) for about 4-5 years before the war in Germany - University of Berlin. His work during the last years in surveying Greek mineral and oil deposits commands general appreciation. I personally have a great esteem for his intellectual capacity, general ability and for his straightforwardness and character. His knowledge of English is workable.

He is considered as one of the best civil servants and his work commands general appreciation. I have no direct knowledge of the adequacy of his English but I would imagine it should be somehow "workable" on account of his long collaboration with American Mission Experts.

Enclosed is a copy of a letter we have just received from Mr. Demetre Karafskakis, who we had invited on August 23, 1963 to be our 1964 Eisenhower Fellow from Greece. It is unfortunate indeed that at this late date he finds himself unable to accept our invitation.

We are cabling today to Mr. William Curran at the Embassy to extend our invitation to Mr. Peter A. Kanellopoulos, who is our next choice. I hope you will agree that this is a wise move.

Frankly, this a bit upsetting to me since it is presumed that when candidates are nominated to us they will be available if invited. It is obviously a serious expenditure of time to invite a man and have him turn us down; in this case it took nineteen weeks, which we can ill afford at this late date.

Thank you very much for your letter of January 8, 1964. I much regret for the inconvenience which a Greek candidate has caused. For your information - and not as an excuse - I must explain that this late hour notice is due to the Government changes; the last Minister of Industry thought that he could not allow the Director General of his Ministry to get away for a series of months. I know that Mr. Karafskakis - who was proposed as an Eisenhower fellow because of the importance of his functions - was trying to clarify the position and had some difficulty precisely because of the change of Ministers.

I am afraid that the same reason and the forthcoming new elections in Greece on February 16 make it very difficult for Mr. Kanellopoulos to accept immediately his invitation - although he is greatly interested - since he is a candidate for parliamentary election. Mr. Kanellopoulos asked whether he can give a final reply about the end of February, and if this is impossible, whether the invitation to him could be extended in another year or so. I explained the difficulties and problems of such a reply.

In view of the above, could I be in touch with the American Embassy here (Mr. Rice, the President of the selection committee is away from Athens) to see whether one or two other candidates of the necessary standing could be proposed for this year's fellowship. If such other candidates - probably from private business - could be selected, the Embassy would cable you their qualifications in order that you could take the final decision. I hope that it will finally be made possible to avoid the loss of this excellent opportunity for a Greek candidate.

Thank you for your letter of January 31 and enclosures. I am sorry that as a result of the new elections difficulties have interfered with the selection of the Greek fellow. Mr. Curran of the U.S. Embassy in Athens and myself tried to find another candidate with strong qualifications. I think we can now recommend to you Professor N. Athanassiadis of the National Technical University of Athens. He was recommended to me by a well-known and able Professor of that school. I also think that his interests and activities are quite important for Greece. He is an expert in mechanical engineering and a consultant of industrial firms. His visit to the United States could be of great value if he becomes well acquainted with scientific and technological progress in the fields of his particular interests as well as with industrial applications in these fields and with the organisation and methods of technical education at various levels - a problem of major importance for Greece.

Since Mr. Kanellopoulos has not given you a definite answer you might consider two alternatives: either wait for his reply which will probably be sent to you after the elections, i.e. about the end of February, or, in the absence of a definite reply from Mr. Kanellopoulos, decide for another fellow - in which case we think here that Professor Athanassiadis is a good candidate for your consideration. Mr. Curran told me that because of his teaching responsibilities Professor Athanassiadis asked whether he could reach Philadelphia by the end of April. Since I am fully aware of the difficulties of such a delay, I think that you could insist on him being there by April 1, in which case I hope he would be able to arrange his work accordingly and be there in time.

I do hope that the special reasons which have caused this year's difficulties will not reappear in the future.



Minutes of Meeting of Selection Committee - June 7, 1966

The second meeting of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowship Selection Committee for Greece was held June 7, Tuesday, at 9:00 a.m. in the offices of the Cultural Attache of the American Embassy. Those persons present: Mr. John Pezmatzoglou, Chairman; Mr. Elias Krimbas; Mr. James Beaverson; Mr. Brian Bojonell; and Mr. Dimitrios Marinopoulos.

The Committee reviewed briefly the meeting of May 27, and confirmed its previous opinion that candidates from Greece should be chosen from the fields of Education (Technical Education) and Communication (Mass Media). The members reviewed the candidates already suggested at the May 27 meeting. The Committee still favors Mr. Angelopoulos as well as both nominees (Iambrias and Karapanayiotis) in the newspaper field. Mr. Mantzovinos is no longer available. Mr. Krimbas suggested Mr. Dimitrios Nianias, age 44, recently elected Professor of Philosophy at the Polytechnion. A student at Oxford, Mr. Nianias speaks fluent English (as does his wife). Professor Nianias is a member of the Executive Committee of the Royal National Foundation as well as serving on a similar committee with the newly dedicated Evgenides Foundation.

Mr. Marinopoulos declared that technical training is urgently needed in Greece and believes we should search for a candidate who fulfills the previously-established criteria as to position and personality, but who will also favorably influence the development of technical training in Greece. Mr. Marinopoulos agreed to look for further candidates in this field. Mr. Beaverson again stressed the importance of education; Mr. Pezmatzoglou will talk with Professor Kakrides, President of the Pedagogical Institute, to learn if he has candidates to suggest who meet the criteria set up by the Committee. Mr. Bojonell stated that the Committee should also consider candidates from Northern Greece, and agreed to talk with Mr. Lansdale at the Farm School, as well as explore the possibilities in this area of the country.

The Committee hopes to complete its nominations at the next meeting which is scheduled for Friday, June 17, at 9:00 a.m. Each member is urged to suggest further candidates. The meeting adjourned at 9:45 a.m.

I have your letter of June 8th concerning the "Eisenhower Exchange Fellowship". I served on that committee about ten years ago.

I would strongly recommend Mr. Demetrios Zannas who is President of Tourism in Northern Greece. He is also President of the Y.M.C.A. and President of the new Yacht Club.

His presidencies, however, do not adequately express his broad capacities. He has almost single-handedly organized and built the new Yacht Club here in Thessaloniki. He has really done a magnificent organizational job with tourism. He has organized parking facilities in Thessaloniki; he has developed a new theater in the woods, and in addition, made many other significant contributions to the development of tourism outside of the Thessaloniki area. He is an advisor to almost all foreign organizations and agencies on an informal basis, and is looked upon with great respect by both Greeks and Americans. He is an attorney and legal advisor to Mobil Oil, as well as to McKee Construction Company. He is one of those people who works 18 hours a day, seven days a week, and when he starts something does his best to see it through to completion.

He has a charming wife who is deeply involved in a variety of service activities including the Y.W.C.A., at least two local orphanages, and any number of other activities.

I had considered him as a possibility ten years ago, but he had not yet developed to the outstanding position of leadership in which he is today. He is now 44, which is slightly above the age limit, but he is young in heart and spirit, and I think could profit greatly from such an experience. I would strongly urge you to consider him as a candidate. You could check further on him through Demetri Papaeferatiou and John Bliss, both of whom know him well.





Minutes of Meeting of Selection Committee - June 17, 1966

The third meeting of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowship Selection Committee for Greece was held on June 17, Friday, at 9:00 a.m. in the offices of the Cultural Attache of the American Embassy. Present were: Mr. John Pezmatzoglou, Chairman; Mr. James Beaverson; Mr. Dimitrios Marinopoulos; Mr. Brian Bojonell. Mr. Krimbas was absent.


In response to the request of the Committee at its meeting of June 7, Mr. Bojonell inquired from Mr. Bruce Lansdale, Director of the American Farm School, about possible candidates from Northern Greece. Mr. Lansdale, in a letter to Mr. Bojonell, suggested Mr. Dimitrios Zannas, Thessaloniki lawyer and citizen active in various community projects. As Mr. Zannas is also active in Mobil-Oil and Greek tourism, Mr. Pezmatzoglou felt it would be useful to consult Mr. John Bliss and Mr. Dim. Papaefstratiou who may be able to supply further support for Mr. Zannas.

The Committee considered at length the name of Costas Krimbas, young Professor of Plant Genetics at the Superior School of Agriculture. Although only 34 years old, he has already distinguished himself in this very important field and seems to meet the criteria set up by the committee for candidates. He studied in Lausanne, obtained his doctorate from the University of Athens, and did graduate study for one year at Columbia University.

Reviewing the names of candidates previously suggested, the Committee tentatively nominated the following four persons (listed in alphabetical order): Mr. Leon Karapanayiotis, Mr. Costas Krimbas, Mr. Takis Lambrias and Mr. Dimitrios Nianias. Mr. Marinopoulos stated he would look further for a persons in the field of technical training. The Committee decided to hold a fourth meeting on Friday, June 24, at 9:00 a.m. Unless other suitable candidates are named at the June 24 meeting, the Committee will recommend that application forms be offered to the four candidates mentioned above. The Committee understands that the applications must be completed by the candidates themselves and should reach the Eisenhower Committee in Philadelphia by the end of July 1966.

The Committee adjourned at 9:45 a.m.

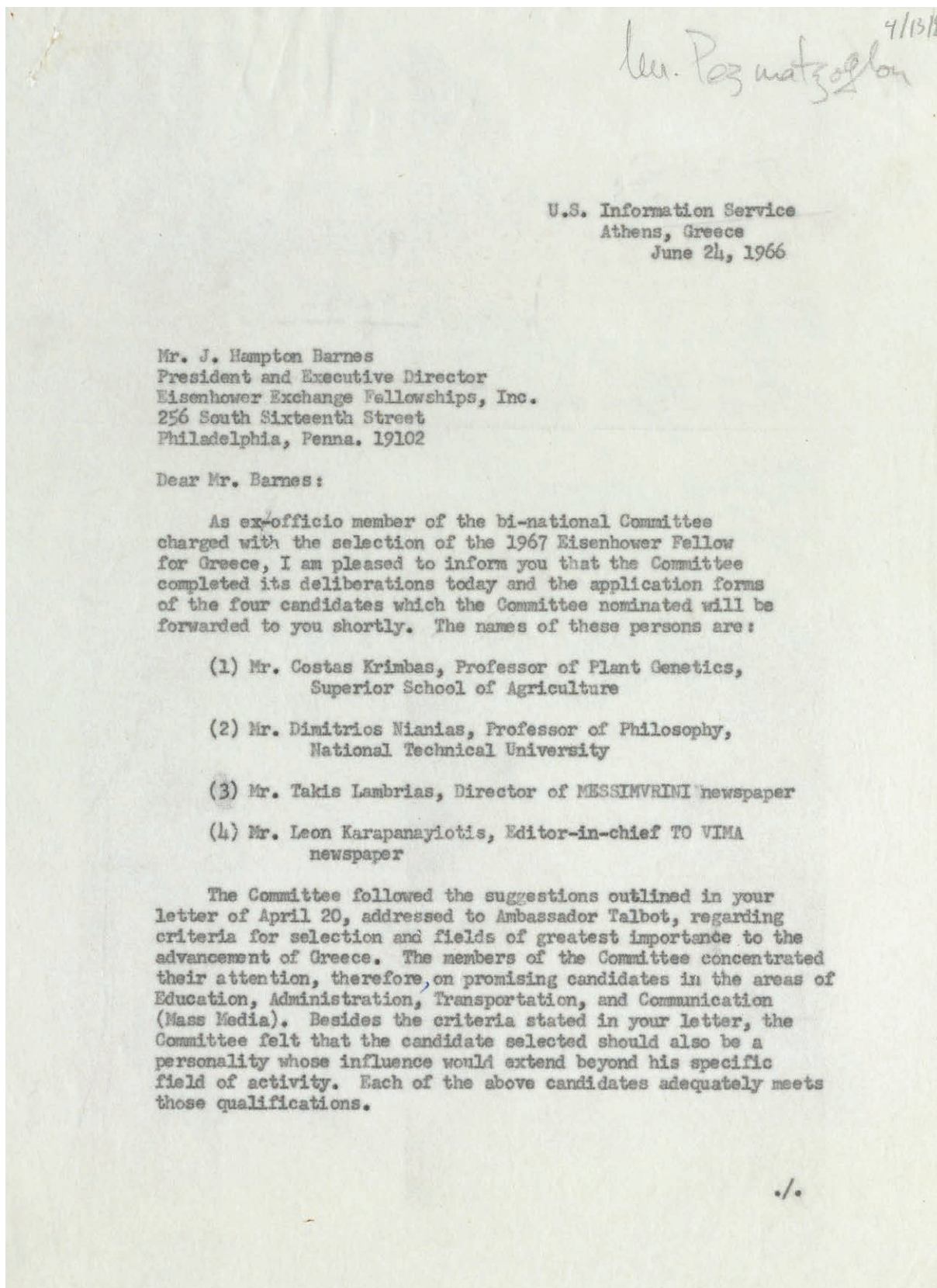

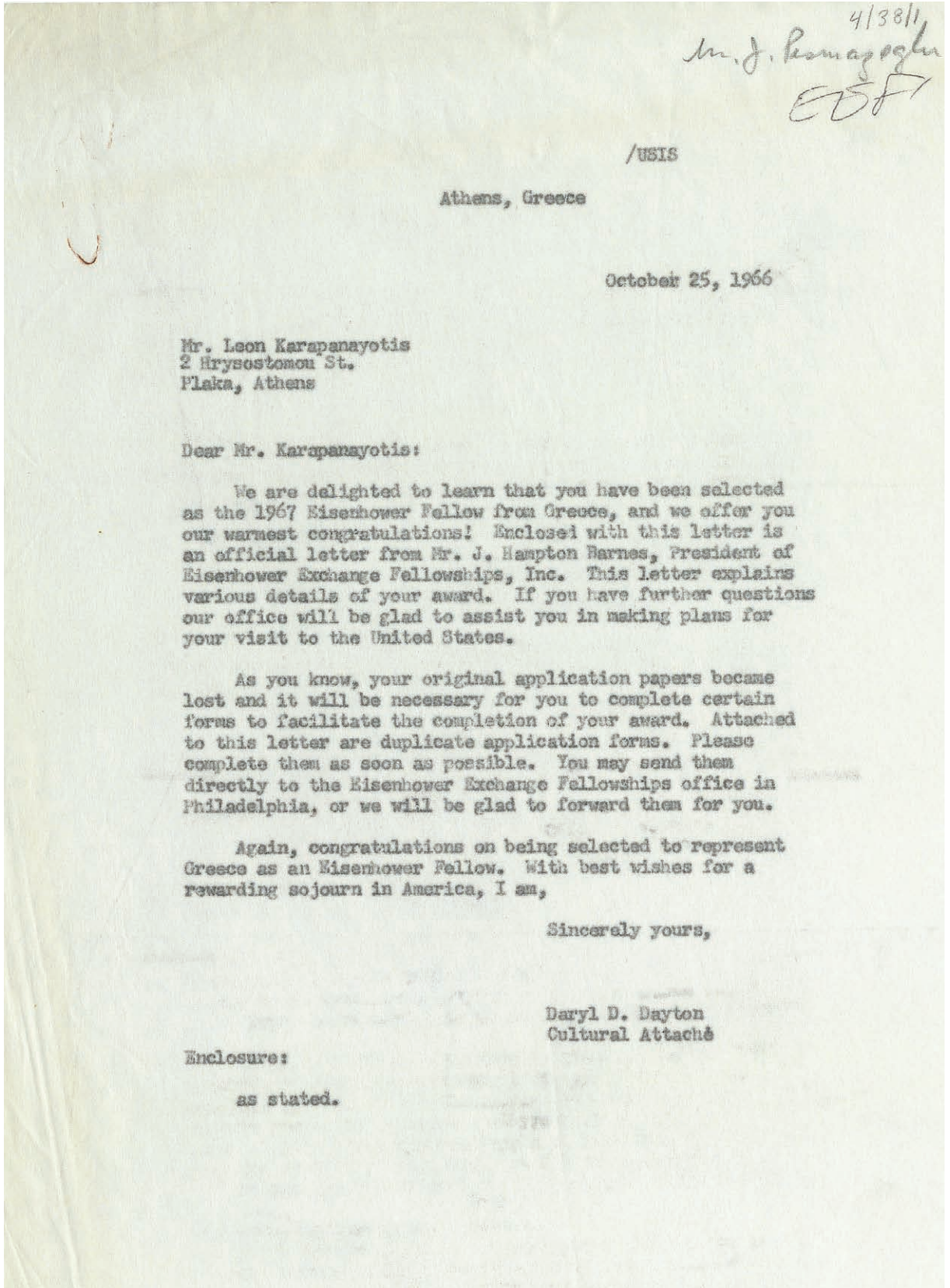

Thank you for your note and the attached copy of your letter to Mr.D.Dayton, Cultural Attaché of the United States Embassy in Athens. I had a long talk with Mr.Karapanayotis and he emphatically assured me that he is greatly interested in accepting your invitation of which he is most appreciative. He also told me that he cabled you confirming his acceptance.

Mr.Karapanayotis is married and will be accompanied by his wife who is a nice young girl writing articles usually of archaeological content.

Mr.Karapanayotis is an able young person with a variety of interests. He has a very good general training and his English is fluent. He is now engaged in following up the political developments in Greece. As I told you, he is the chief editor of a leading Greek newspaper called "The Tribune" ("To Vima" in Greek), of a long-standing liberal tradition, now strongly opposed to the present Greek Government. Although I fully share the general orientation of this newspaper, I must make it clear to you that I am not in agreement with some specific views on particular issues and arguments as presented in recent years by it. But my affinity with the general ideology and attitudes represented by this newspaper remain and is reflected in the fact that I have always published in it my articles in Greece.

I am sure that Karapanayotis will make good use of his visit to the United States. The delays in filling in the forms and sending and clarifying the situation are probably associated with organisational aspects not unconnected with the variety of activities in which he is entangled.

I am conveying to you this information confidentially in order to explain the situation. In fact, I always think that Mr.Karapanayotis is the first choice and hope that he will be coming next spring to

Philadelphia. He assures me that nothing will prevent him from doing so. But in case that as a result of the political situation in Greece he could not get away (and this is a hypothesis which I must state in order to be on the safe side), the next choice should be, I think, Professor Krimbas.


Thank you for your letter of November 30th addressed to my home.

I am afraid this letter is going to come as quite a blow to you. We have, after a great deal of thought and reflection, come to the unhappy conclusion that neither Mr. Kiortsis or Mr. Bozonis are of a sufficiently high caliber to be included in the Eisenhower Fellowships' 1967 program. I am fully aware of the difficulties involved in getting appropriate people who have both stature and availability to be considered as proper nominees for the Eisenhower Fellowships. As you know, we were very pleased with Mr. Karapanayotis' qualifications. He seemed eminently suited to our purpose and our high criteria for the Fellowships. It was a pity he could not, at the last minute, accept our invitation.

When Messrs. Kiortsis and Bozonis were nominated we examined their qualifications with deep interest. As a matter of fact, today I received Mr. Bozonis' application from Daryl Dayton at the Embassy.

Let me dwell for a moment on the salient aspects of Mr. Bozonis' achievements and present position. The papers say that he is now the Instructor of Ancient and Modern Greek at Athens College. Further, it states that he has held this position since 1952. Despite the fact that he points out that he has been appointed a member of the educational studies committee at the College, the fact still remains that he has been in his present position without marked promotion for 15 years. There is no evidence in his bio-data sheet, nor in his statement of purpose, that he could be considered a leader in his field or a significant influence on Greek higher education from a broad point of view. In short, we fail to see any evidence whatsoever of



his going to the top in his chosen area of interest. In regard to Mr. Kiortsis' qualifications, he is a professor of Zoology and Biology at the University of Athens. Here again we can see no substantial evidence of his being a key figure in the field of higher education or even science in Greece.


As you already well know, I am a profound admirer of Greece as are many of our distinguished Trustees. Nevertheless, in all conscience I believe that I would be doing a disfavor to the standards of the Fellowships if we brought to this country anything less than the best. Naturally I was torn between a desire to see Greece represented in the 1967 group and my obligation as the chief executive of this organization to continue to maintain these high standards. Please do not feel that this reflects on the efforts of the Selection Committee. There is no question but that they have worked hard and long. I have no doubt that this situation has come to pass simply because the key people in the Greek economy are not able to leave the country during this crucial transition period in your history. My decision therefore must be to omit Greece from the 1967 program. As you know, Greece has been invited for participation in the 1968 program. Let us hope that with this additional time it will be possible to single out an outstanding potential candidate for the Fellowship of that year.

My dear Hampton,

Upon my return today from a short absence abroad on a Government mission I found your letter of January 31 and your subsequent telegram. I feel I should write to you on behalf of all members of the Selection Committee of which I had the honor to preside to protest for the erroneous impression which I think has been created. We were all fully aware of the highest qualifications required for the award of an Eisenhower Exchange Fellowship and we have never lost sight of these requirements. Perhaps I should remind you that in the Selection Committee participated the Deputy Governor of the Mortgage Bank of Greece, the Chairman of the Greek Industrialists, the President of the Athens College and the Athens representative of Pan-American. We also had the benefit of the active participation of the Cultural Attaché of the American Embassy, Mr. Daryl Dayton, with whom we discussed all our problems. If the content of your letter were justified, the unavoidable implication would be that we did a rather poor job which, I do not think, has been the case.

Let me first say that we are fully aware of the inconvenience caused to you by the inability of the candidates we initially proposed to accept this year's fellowship. As I wrote to you, in our initial discussions we tried to find people of action. It so happened that the three of them were entangled in the political developments which made it impossible for them to get away from Greece. But I wish to assure you emphatically that when we searched for other candidates we did not allow any hasty deliberation as apparently the impression was created in Philadelphia.

In connection with the last two candidates whom we proposed, I wish to state the following. Professor Kiortsis is considered a young, active and promising scientist and his standing is reflected in his recent election to the Board of the Royal Hellenic Research Foundation. This is an institution administered by a group of very high level scientists and scholars under the Chairmanship of His Majesty the King. I have been one of the initial members of it since 1958 and I can assure you that the selection of the Board members is done with the utmost care. When we proposed Kiortsis for the Eisenhower Fellowship we thought that with the growing emphasis on high level scientific training and research, a young scientist who distinguished himself at the University of Geneva and has been active in work of interest to NATO and the American Government would not be an unsuitable candidate.

Mr. Bozonis was proposed by the President of the Athens College, Mr. Beaverson, and I fully backed his proposal because I know personally Mr. Bozonis. Mr. Beaverson told me that they were thinking of Mr. Bozonis as a would-be Co-Director of the Athens College - although this is perhaps something which could not be openly stated until a final decision is taken. I thought that to become a Head of a Greek-American Institution which is generally considered as one of the best educational establishments in this country and a powerful link between Greece and the United States would not be something unimportant. I also venture to suggest that sometimes being responsible at any moment for the education of more than 1,200 boys constitutes an assignment perhaps not much less significant than the job of many politicians.

I felt I should convey to you immediately this information to correct the unwarranted impressions which were created. I think that if some additional information were requested on the recent proposals some of the conclusions which were apparently drawn could have been prevented.

As you can readily understand, the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships is deeply disappointed that the government of Greece has not seen fit to allow Mr. Leon Carapanayotis to leave the country and take up his Fellowship in the United States.

In your judgment, would it be possible to make further inquiry into the possibility that Mr. Carapanayotis might still get an authorization for his visit here? We feel very strongly that a man of his calibre and distinction in his profession could have a brilliant experience here. I am writing this letter in my capacity as Chairman of the Eisenhower Exchange Fellowships Selection Committee for Greece.

I know that Mr. Leon Karapanayotis, Editor of a leading daily Athens newspaper, notified you of his inability to make use of his Fellowship in 1972, on account of professional responsibilities, as I understand.

After an exchange of views with Mr. Wertime, Cultural Attaché at the Embassy of the United States, who closely follows the work of our Committee, we would like to propose for the 1972 Eisenhower Fellowship Dr. Themistocles Kanaghinis, one of the outstanding candidates in the group selected by our Committee last May.

Professor Kakridis, the other distinguished candidate we also proposed, would most probably be prevented from making use of the fellowship in 1972, and in order to avoid loss of time, we strongly suggest the invitation to be addressed to Dr. Kanaghinis. He is a leading young medical doctor, who has gone through a long postgraduate training in England but has not been in America. He has wide interests in problems of public health and hospital organisation as well as in medical education. He is able and anxious to make use of the fellowship in 1972. He fully satisfies the qualifications of distinction and leadership, and there has not been an Eisenhower Fellow from this field hitherto.

We hope this suggestion would be accepted and that the invitation could be addressed as early as possible, in order that Dr. Kanaghinis starts immediately his preparation to be in Philadelphia on time, as required.

Dear John:

I am terribly sorry not to have written to you long before this, but I hope you will not consider my neglect as a matter of disinterest because, of course, it is not. I have been unbelievably swamped with work ever since my return to the University, and I'm afraid that what has suffered most has been my correspondence. I'm terribly sorry for this, because I really think that my friends -- especially those in situations like your own -- are far more deserving of and entitled to my time and attention than anyone here, but I am afraid I have been filled more with good intentions than I have with good deeds. But I assure you that that will change: that I will not delay my letters any longer, and certainly not to the Pesmazoglous.

But even if I haven't been attentive to my correspondence, I haven't been totally inattentive to my responsibilities. I have been in touch with some members of the staff of the American Association of University Professors about your case -- and about the situation of Greek scholars in general -- and only last week, while I was at a conference in Boston, I spoke to last year's president of the AAUP about you. Before I leave my office tonight, I will be writing to Professor Sanford Kadish, who is currently the president of the AAUP, and it is my hope -- our hope -- that at least we will be able to have a resolution passed on the situation in Greece at the next AAUP meeting. I don't think that that will dissuade the colonels, but at least it will let the victims of the colonels know that the world has not forgotten them and that there are American scholars who are concerned, deeply concerned, about what is happening in your country. Dear Yanko and Miranda:

I called you at your flat when I was last in Athens, at the end of September, when I passed through for only a day and a half, returning here from 3 weeks of consultations in Washington. I understood you were away on an island, and knowing how much you both needed a rest I didn't pursue the subject at all. Later I was told that you were on Mykonos, but didn't have a phone, so it would have been futile to try to call you there. I'm very sorry I missed you then, but there may be another chance, sooner than I expected, as we are leaving here very shortly, are being transferred to Washington, and if I can work out the travel arrangements we may be able to pass through Athens on the way back, however briefly. We'll certainly call you if we do; it will probably be three to four weeks from now.

I am in process ~~of~~ of closing down this Embassy for good, that is, for as long as the ruling General here remains in power. He has continued to harass us, threatened to put all American citizens in prison, starting with me, if we intervened in the Middle East war, then he kicked out our 6 Marine Guards, who provided the only security we had left. So we have had enough now, and decided it was time to leave. Louise and Chris were evacuated to Nairobi for security reasons ten days ago, and are waiting for me there. I hope to complete the closure in six days' time, kiss the General goodbye, and then fly to Nairobi myself as the last man out. I hope I make it. I want to thank you for the nice blue komboloi you sent via Louise. I carry it all the time, as a good luck charm, though I'm afraid it hasn't been working very well for me lately. But who knows, maybe it has been working; maybe things would be worse without it, although not much worse.

I'm not sorry to leave, just regret the speed, because it is not easy to close a place down in haste. Let's hope we meet soon in Athens, and until then, love from us all,

Dear Mr. Secretary:

It has come to my attention from reliable sources that Professor John Pezmazoglu, former Deputy Governor of the Bank of Greece and one of Greece's truly outstanding men, is probably being badly mistreated during his current imprisonment by the military authorities. These same sources, who fear for his physical and mental well-being, reveal that he was brutally mishandled during his previous imprisonment by these same authorities.

On both humanitarian grounds and because of the past and potentially future importance of Professor Pezmazoglu in Greece's public affairs, I would like to urge you to use on his behalf the considerable influence the United States has with the Greek Junta. As a minimum, I would hope that guarantees would be given to safeguard Professor Pezmazoglu's physical and mental well-being, and that acceptable members of the medical profession and independent international observers be permitted to periodically visit him to certify that these guarantees are being observed.

My interest in this matter stems from the six-year period, from 1960 to 1966, I served as Executive Director of the Greek Government Foreign Trade Administration, and Adviser to the Ministry of Coordination and Bank of Greece. During this time, I came to know many of Greece's leading political and economic figures. Amongst these, I consider Professor John Pezmazoglu one of the best, as well as a personal friend. John Pezmazoglu is also a proven friend of the United States, and in this moment of his greatest difficulty deserves the help that only this country can give effectively.

I look forward to hearing from you at your earliest convenience.


The Secretary has asked me to reply to your letter of May 25, concerning the recent arrest and imprisonment of Professor John Pasmazoglou by Greek authorities.

The Greek Government is aware of our concern for the fair treatment of detainees and the application of due process of law and our consistent opposition to the violation of fundamental human rights. However, there are limitations to the inquiries and representations that the United States Government can make on behalf of individuals who are arrested and detained by the authorities of other countries and who have no claim to American nationality. Since our representatives do not have direct access to such imprisoned persons, we cannot confirm or refute allegations of mistreatment.

We will continue to express our concern on this issue to the Greek Government whenever such representations would in our judgment be appropriate and effective.

I regret that I am unable to provide a more positive response to your concern.

The Subcommittee on Europe will hear testimony from Ambassador Tasca on March 27 concerning present American policy toward Greece. During a discussion of this coming event last week, Cong. Fraser asked if it would be possible for someone to come from Greece in the next month or two to give a Greek view of events since November 1973. We simultaneously suggested you as a very appropriate witness.

I know, of course, of your many past difficulties with the preceding government and would understand, therefore, your reluctance to consider this invitation. If, however, you were considering a visit to the United States this year(or could be persuaded to do so) please let me know.

It obviously would be of great assistance to us to be able to present a witness as knowledgeable as you are a) to counter the testimony of Tasca who will, I am certain, explain exactly how and why nothing can or should be done by the United States in Greece; and b) to describe, in your exceptionally good English, but from a Greek viewpoint what might be done and the consequences for the United States if it decides to do nothing.

No one(except Fraser) knows of this letter so please feel free to be entirely frank in your reply.




I am delighted to receive your card and to know that you are once again in circulation. I hope that you have suffered no ill effects from the outrageous mistreatment to which you have been subject.

This is a hasty letter to let you know personally, before the news breaks officially, that our family is about to leave Greece after our forty eventful months here. I have just received word that the White House is ready to announce my resignation as of January 20.

I owe it to you to explain that several personal considerations unrelated to Greece have led me to ask to be relieved at the convenient moment of the transition in Washington rather than a little later. In any event the early appointment of a new American Ambassador to Athens would have been expected since (rather to my surprise, when I stopped to think of it) I have now been here longer than any of my predecessors since Lincoln MacVeigh. What I regret most at this moment is that accidents of timing have prevented our giving you and our other friends more notice.

We shall leave Greece sadly, most particularly because of our separation from the warm friends we have found here. We surely hope to see you again before our departure on January 20 despite the few and I have no doubt hectic days that remain. Even so, let me seize the opportunity of this letter to tell you how much my wife and I have enjoyed our association with you during these busy and often tumultuous times.

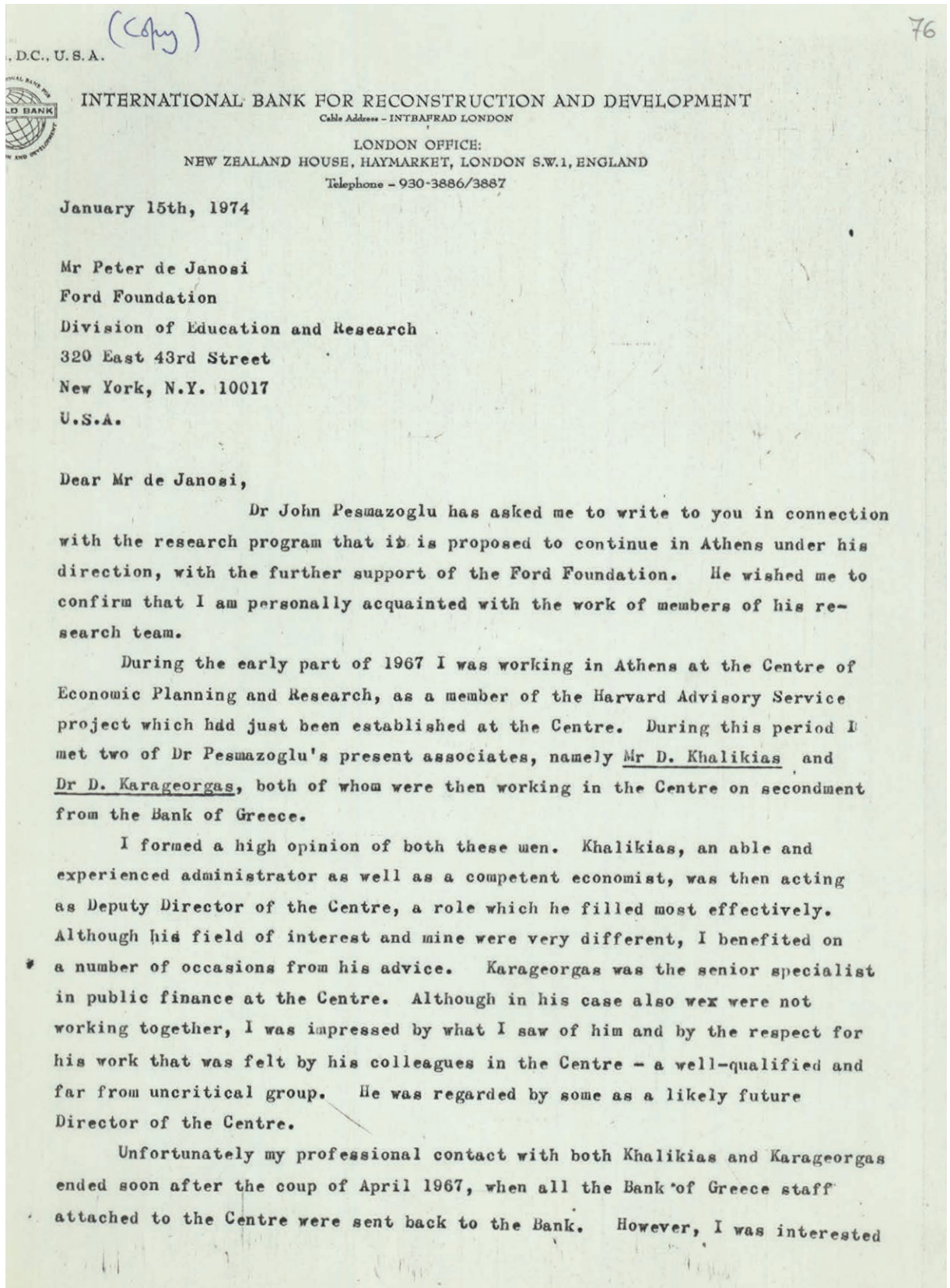

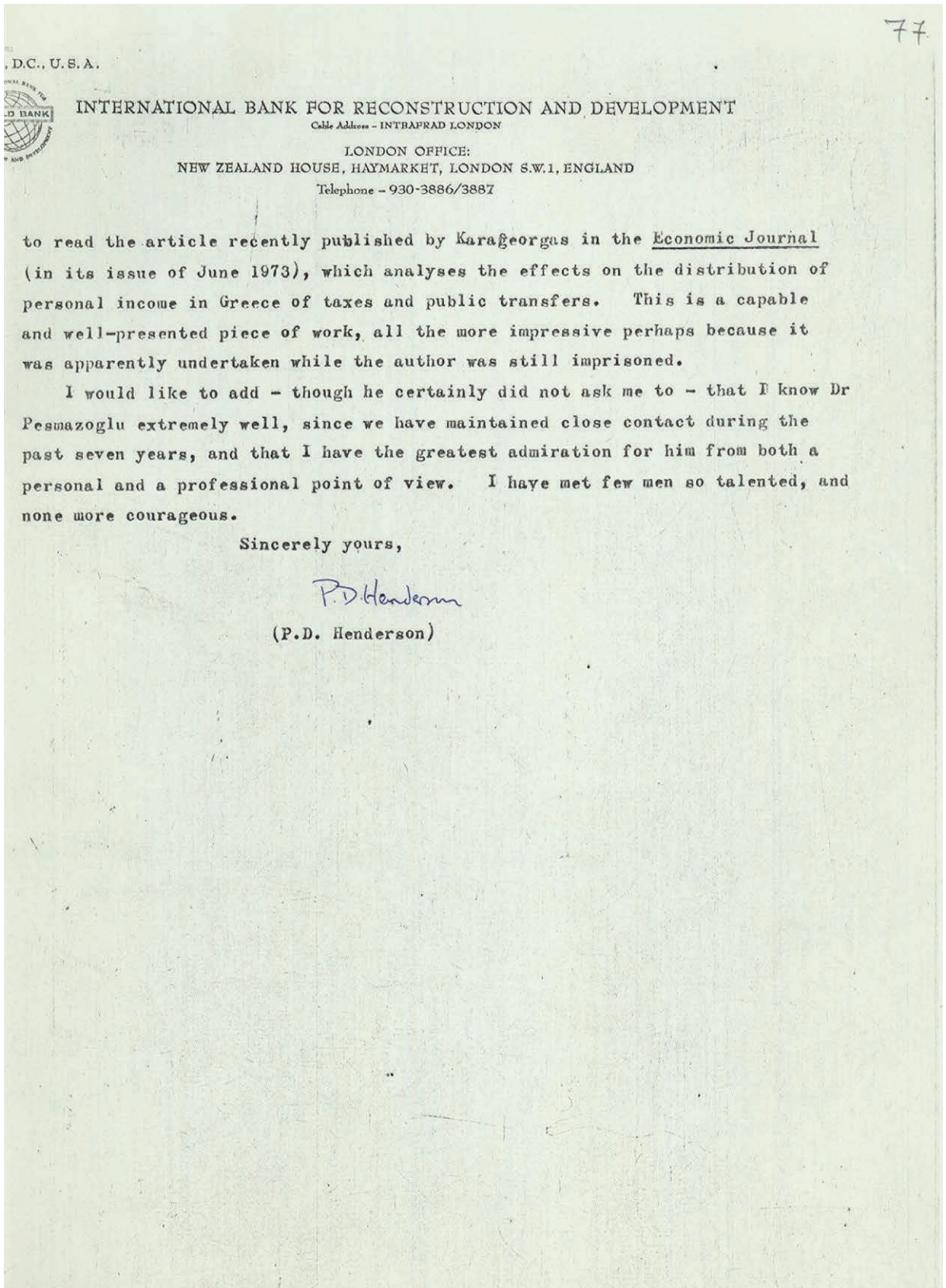

I am pleased to write to you on the professional abilities of Professor Dionysios Karageorgas, whom I have known for more than fifteen years.

He was one of the best economists in the Research Directorate of the Bank of Greece. After taking his Ph.D. in England he became the senior expert of the Bank on matters of public finance. He was transferred for a number of years to the Center of Economic Research and Planning, where he held senior positions.

He is a well trained and highly qualified economist, well acquainted with modern quantitative analysis. He has a sound judgement which enables him to assess correctly economic policies and their impact. His textbook (in Greek), reflecting his work as Professor of Public Finance at the Panteios School of Political Science, is modern in its approach, comprehensive, intelligible and very well received by students. It is a long time that we have not been in touch. The important developments which took place since the end of July meant my complete absorption in public life. After the fall of the dictatorship I was, as you probably know, Minister of Finance and then took part in the elections of November 17. I am now Member of Parliament for Athens in the "Center Union New Forces", which is the principal opposition party with a liberal progressive orientation increasingly close to the social democratic parties of Western Europe.

I would also add that all participants in the Ford Foundation project have assumed important responsibilities. Mr. Evangelos Voloudakis is Director General of the Center of Planning and Economic Research. Mr. D. Chalikias is The Economic Adviser of the Bank of Greece with extensive responsibilities on monetary and financial policies. Mr. Rossetos Fakiolas is back at the Center of Planning and Economic Research as a senior expert covering labor problems. Professor George Chalkiopoulos was nominated Chairman of the Board of the Center of Planning and Economic Research and the Deputy Governor of the Mortgage Bank of Greece. Mr. Nicolas Kyriazidis, who also occasionally participated in certain parts of our research, is now the Deputy Governor of the Bank of Greece and The Chairman of the Intergovernmental Committee on our association with the Common Market.

A great part of the work as planned early last summer is at an advanced stage. We expect that the work on the five main investigations will be promoted and completed early next year, as soon as some of the major and urgent tasks of the reorganisation of the State after the dictatorship are well under way.

I, therefore, express the wish of all of us to see the arrangements and procedures in force, as finally shaped in the early summer of 1974 with the Institute of International Education, remain valid until the completion of the work. I will personally retain in fact the responsibility over the project but I think that Professor Chalkiopoulos, a highly respected professor of economics, should become the man formally in charge. I wish to emphasize that nothing will change in substance. I do hope this will not be impossible and will not cause a new complication or delays in the procedures.

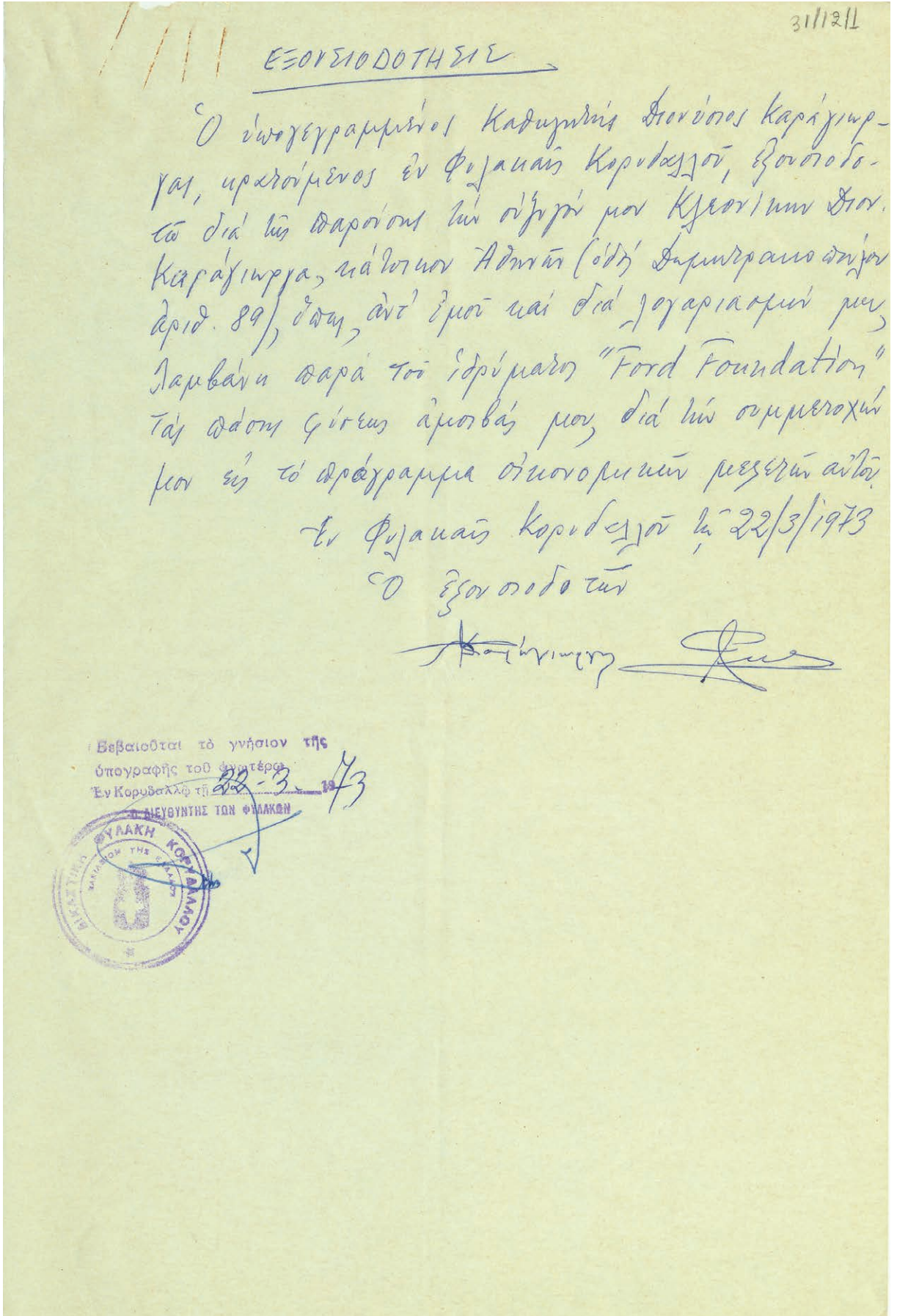

But we are all anxious to see the work completed, in view of the significance of the results obtained from the research and their particular interest for Greek development policy. As you will see in my letter to Mr. ^{de} Janossi, I express my strong recommendation and hope for the continuation of the project. In view of my new formal position, as a Member of Parliament, I thought and proposed the whole project to be placed under the supervision of Professor George Chalkiopoulos, a senior and highly respected expert who has been associated from the outset with our work. All other members will continue participating under the same arrangements and I myself shall remain directly interested and follow ^{up} the progress of work. We are all anxious that the procedures established with you last July will remain valid to the end.
